NAGALAND POLICE CAUTIONS AGAINST CYBER FRAUDS

Nagaland Police re-cautions the public against the various cyber frauds and crimes with the following Modus Operandi prevalent in the State:

- Theft of identity and photos of the victims, often of well-known persons, which is openly available on the internet and social media, i.e. Facebook, WhatsApp and Instagram etc. by fraudsters and accessing the contacts and mobile numbers of friends, colleagues, etc. from the official websites/contact list: The fraudsters send phishing messages through WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, etc. asking the victim's friends, and colleagues, for help in the form of money transfers, common merchant card purchases, e-wallet transfers, etc. They may also solicit and recommend some fraudulent apps requiring the transfer and deposit of money.
- Extortion or blackmailing/extortion of victims by contact/communication through the Facebook chat, WhatsApp etc: Generally, the victim is convinced or persuaded to chat, video chat, or exchange photos through social media. The conversation or video may or may not be of sexual or of compromising nature and the scamsters resort to morphing their pictures and superimposing compromising pictures to harass and threaten the victims with dire consequences. The fraudsters are professionals and try to overwhelm the victims through various aggressive tactics and language. Some victims, out of alarm, make payments through various online payment apps, UPIs, etc.
- The Bitcoin scam: Potential victims are lured to invest/buy Bitcoins by fraudsters who entice the victims by sending messages and links, and also by hacking the social media accounts of friends of the victim and making it seem like their friends are endorsing the particular Bitcoin.
- The Fake Online Shopping Apps and shopping Pages/Accounts in popular social media platforms: The fraudsters lure the victims by offering attractive offers/discounts through their pages. After the victims make the payment, the delivery is not made.

The general public is being made aware of the widespread operation of such cyber fraudsters and is advised to remain vigilant and not be duped by such scams. The fraudsters are professionals and take extra effort to appear genuine. They operate through multiple identities, accounts, phone numbers, etc.

As reiterated earlier, Nagaland Police appeals to the general public not to transfer money without completely verifying the authenticity of the account, be it through bank transfer, easy money transfer Apps, UPIs, e-Wallets, etc. and not to accept requests from strangers without verification, no matter how genuine and attractive they may appear, and not to fall for advertisements or links for Bitcoins, Online Game Prizes/Gifts, Lottery, Cash Back, Easy Loans, Stock Market Investment Scams, Quick Returns, etc.

Consequent to the consultative meeting of Engineering Departments, under the Government of Nagaland with NBOCW Welfare Board and Department of Finance, Government of Nagaland, all establishments including Government Bodies, Public Sector Undertakings, etc. liable to pay 1% cess

ORENPOMO KIKON SWORN IN AS MEMBER OF NPSC

Orenpomo Kikon was sworn-in as a Member of the Nagaland Public Service Commission during an oath taking ceremony held at Dr. Imkongliba Ao Hall, Raj Bhavan, Kohima on 8th June 2022. Governor of Assam and Nagaland, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi administered the 'Oath of Secrecy' in the presence of Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio. Meanwhile, Chief Secretary, Nagaland, J. Alam, IAS initiated the proceedings of the ceremony.

FUNCTIONING OF THE DISTRICT OFFICES OF THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS IN CHÜMOUKEDIMA DISTRICT

The State Home Department has stated that the various departments are currently still in the process of making their District Offices functional in a suitable manner in Chümoukedima district, and the same is likely to take some more time. Hence, in the interest of continuity, and ensuring that the various services being provided by the departments in the newly created district of Chümuokedima proceed in an unhindered manner, and to further cover up the period till the District Offices become suitably functional, it is temporarily provided that all the Heads of Offices in Dimapur district will also be considered to be holding additional charge of the Head of Office of the respective Department for Chümoukedima district.

The Heads of Offices concerned will further regularly report to the Deputy Commissioner of Chümoukedima whenever required to do so for the activities being undertaken pertaining to the department in the jurisdiction of the District of Chümoukedima, and will provide his/her services as a part of any Committee/Team etc. which may be required to be formed/constituted as per any instructions of the Government for Chümoukedima district.

AH&VS DEPARTMENT ISSUES DIFFERENTIAL FEATURES OF PIG DISEASES

With the occurrence of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the State, clarity on various pig diseases appears to be lacking amongst the public. Hence, to clarify and end the confusion of pig diseases, especially African Swine Fever, Classical Swine Fever & Swine Flu. The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services has informed the general public of the difference in the above three diseases as per enclosure.

This is being issued to enable the public and piggery farmers to take the necessary precautionary measures from the pigs as well as from a zoonotic point of view.

NAGALAND PARASPORTS COMMITTEE CONSTITUTED

PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE GRANTS (PIG) UNDER NECTAR TO STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN EDUCATION REFORM

School Grants are available for all 1953 Government Schools in Nagaland under the name 'Performance Incentive Grants' as part of the Governance and Capacity Building component of Nagaland Education Project - The Lighthouse (NECTAR), a project funded by the World Bank. Grant can be availed by the School Management Committees (SMCs) and School Management and Development Committees (SMDCs).

Focusing on the strong culture of community led development in Nagaland, the project emphasizes to reinforce the relevance of 'Communitisation' of schools and strengthen the community's role as guardians of public institutions. It has been observed that lack of information and capacity of the SMCs and SMDCs has hindered their involvement in the school system. Therefore, to build capacity and to enhance participation and promote commitment of the SMCs and SMDCs, the Performance Incentive Grants is being made available for all the 1953 Government Schools in Nagaland in three batches over a two year period.

Recognising that every school is unique with varying needs, the SMCs and SMDCs are given the liberty to make their own need-based proposals (Action Plan). While the guidelines discourage major infrastructural works, the committees are encouraged to focus on improving and augmenting the school learning environment and undertake urgent repair and renovations. As part of community engagement, activities like monthly SMC/SMDC meetings, half yearly Parent Teacher meetings, outreach to dropouts and vulnerable groups have been made mandatory. The committees are also encouraged to come up with innovative activities and ways to revive indigenous practices through story telling sessions, hands-on sessions in handicraft, weaving, gardening, farming, etc.

Out of 1953 Government Schools, 1741 submitted applications for the first batch. A total of 743 applications were shortlisted for the first batch based on specific set of criteria after thorough screening of the applications. Orientation and Capacity Building for the SMCs and SMDCs of the shortlisted schools covering all the districts were conducted in the District Headquarters from 16th May 2022 to 24th May 2022. PIG proposals for 738 schools have been approved and the funds will be disbursed directly to the SMC and SMDC accounts by the last week of June 2022 post signing of the MoUs. The work implementation period is from 1st July to 15th November 2022.

In order to ensure accountability of the activities and works undertaken by the SMCs and SM-DCs, a robust monitoring mechanism has been put in place which requires the committees to maintain all records pertaining to their activities in a Monitoring and Reporting booklet which comprise of easy to fill templates. Activity records have to be validated with date and time stamped pictures of 'Before' and 'After' intervention period and has been made mandatory for all categories of repair and civil works. All procurements should be validated by bills and vouchers in original. Surprise monitoring visits will be undertaken by Education Officials and Project Officials as well as the Area Administrative Officers to further provide any course correction steps if required.

In order to address the issue of accountability and judicious use of funds, an assessment mechanism has been put in place wherein the Area Administrative Officers have assigned as the external assessors who will conduct an on-site assessment of all the activities and works undertaken after the end of each installment. A 'Completion Certificate' will be issued if works are found satisfactory, failing which the SMCs/SMDCs will not be eligible for the subsequent installments. In the event of any misuse of funds, the SMCs/SMDCs may be blacklisted and furthermore excluded from availing future grants from the Project/Department.

DR. NGANGSHI APPOINTED CHIEF WHIP OF NPF PARTY

In exercise of the powers conferred under Article V, Clause 10 of the Constitution of the Naga Peoples Front (NPF), Dr. Shürhozelie Liezietsu, President, NPF appointed Dr. Ngangshi K. Ao as the Chief Whip of NPF Legislature Party w.e.f. 30/04/2022.

KUZHOLUZO ELECTED LEADER OF NPF PARTY

In pursuance of the provisions in Rule 3(4) of the Members of Nagaland Legislative Assembly (Disqualification on Ground of Defection) Rules 2019, the Speaker has been intimated that Kuzholuzo Nienu, MLA has been unanimously elected as the Leader of NPF Legislature Party w.e.f. 30/04/2022.

PARTIAL MODIFICATION OF PLASTIC WASTE MANAGEMENT RULES

The Urban Development Department issued a partial modification notification to "Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules 2021 notified by the Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Government of India, prohibiting identified Single-Use Plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential, by 2022. The Department further notifies that the Governor of Nagaland is pleased to impose a 'Ban on Single-Use Plastic in Nagaland' to eradicate the menace of plastic and the serious environmental and ecological challenges posed by the rampant use of plastics.

The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale, and use of earn/bag made of virgin or recycled plastic shall not be less than 75 (seventy-five) microns in thickness w.e.f. the 30th September 2021 and 120 (one hundred and twenty) microns in thickness w.e.f. the 31st December. 2022. Further, a non-woven plastic carry bag shall not be less than 60 Gram per Square Meter (GSM) w.e.f. the 30th September 2022.

The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale, and use of following single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited w.e.f. the 1st July 2022:

- (a) Earbuds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene (thermocol) for decoration
- (b) Plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straws, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or Poly-Vinyl Chloride (PVC) banners less than 100 micron, stirrers.

All other clauses mandated in the 'Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016' and 'Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021' should be strictly adhered to.

All individual, institution and commercial establishments (educational institutions, offices, hotels, shops, restaurants, religious institutions/faith-based institutions, industrial establishments, banquet halls, etc.) and Central and State Government Departments/Agencies/Commissions/PSUs/ Missions, etc. including Militaries/Paramilitaries in the State shall abide by the aforesaid ban and any breach shall be liable for penalties. FTII CONDUCTS SCREEN ACTING TRAINING

A basic course in screen acting training was conducted by the Film & Television Institute of India (FTII) from 23rd May to 3rd June 2022 at the Directorate of Information & Public Relations, Kohima. The 10-day online training was conducted by FTII in collaboration with the Department of Information & Public Relations, Nagaland, the nodal department for films in Nagaland.

Resource person of the training, Anita Salim expressed her happiness at the progress made by the students. She hoped that the students will continue to work hard and make a name for themselves. Anita Salim is an alumnus of FTII who has performed in various plays and has been conducting various workshops for students, amateurs and professionals since 1984. She cofounded of 'The Phoenix Players,' where she is also an actor, mentor and producer. Aaryama Salim, Anita's son, who is an actor, also took up a session.

During the course of the training, the participants were taught on various exercises on improvisation, visualization, imagination, monologue etc. They were also taught on how to get in character, interact and use their surroundings.

A five-day film appreciation course, conducted by the Film and Television Institute of India (FTII), in collaboration with the Department of Information & Public Relations, Nagaland was held from 13^{th} to 17^{th} June 2022 at the Directorate of IPR, Kohima.

The resource persons for the course were National Award-winning filmmakers, Avinash Roy and Jasmine Kaur Roy, who have

collaborated under the banner, Wanderlust Films, and have produced and directed short films and documentaries for various national and international organizations like UNESCO, UNDP, UN Women South Asia, and Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Their documentary film, Amoli, won the Best Investigative Film at the 66th National Films Award.

Through the film appreciation course, the participants were taught to understand both the content and form of cinema. It enabled them to demystify the language of films and study its evolution. The participants were also taught about the creative and technical aspects of films. Short films and clips were watched and relevant aspects were discussed. Sessions on film grammar, screenplay, scenes, cinematography, documentary filmmaking, editing, etc. were taken up during the course.

FTTI, Pune is an autonomous educational institute under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India. Set up in 1960 and operational since 1961, as a premier institution engaged in imparting education in various skills associated with films and television, FTII today ranks among the top 10 film schools in the world.

As part of the country wide celebrations under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav of Government of India, FTII has decided to advance the cause of film education by conducting online short courses, free of cost, for scheduled tribes participants residing in the State. It has successfully conducted trainings in smartphone film making and screenplay writing in January and April this year respectively.

MEETING OF STF ON PLASTIC WASTE MANAGEMENT AND ELIMINATION OF SINGLE-USE PLASTIC HELD

The 1st meeting of the Special Task Force (STF) on Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules 2021 and elimination of Single-Use Plastic (SUP) was held at the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, Kohima on 2nd June 2022 under the chairmanship of the Chief Secretary of Nagaland, J. Alam, IAS.

The Nagaland Pollution Control Board presented the draft Comprehensive Action Plan on elimination of SUP and discussions were made point wise on the Action Plan. Deliberating on survey and inspection, it was discussed that extensive survey for identified SUP waste generation was needed where the District Task Force will conduct extensive market survey for assessment of availability of SUPs in the market. Shops, vendors and commercial establishments should keep two separate bins for segregation of waste at source. In this regard, the Chief Secretary stressed on the need to update waste collection system, whereby separate trucks or trucks with separate containers/chambers are to be used for waste collection. The Board decided that each town/ULB is to have its own action plan according to its need and situation.

On the issue of checking and inspection, the Chief Secretary reminded the Board that intensifying inspection and monitoring of stockist and vendors of identified SUP should be carried out stringently, however harassments to vendors should be avoided. He suggested that preinformation should be disseminated trough the print and electronic medium. It was also decided that penalties on traders/vendors dealing with non-permitted plastics will be levied and collected on the spot.

For systematic identification and monitoring of SUPs, it was suggested and agreed upon that booklets along with samples of banned items shall be sent to all ULDs and DTFs for ready reference.

The Board agreed that due significance should be given to encourage the practice of carrying own bags while shopping, and also promote the use of jute bags as practiced earlier. In this regard, the suggestions were made to tie up with telecom service providers to serve reminders in the form of SMS, flash message etc. to encourage shoppers to carry their own bags while shopping.

The meeting agreed that tea stalls should use only stainless steel, glass, paper cups, earthen cups or any other permissible material other than plastic.

The Chief Secretary suggested that allotted selling points should be made at the entrance of markets for sale of plastic bags alternatives. The meeting decided that the Departments of Urban Development, Municipal Affairs and Rural Development should formulate its own working plan and bring forth the same for discussion and approval.

STATE-LEVEL COMMITTEE MEETING FOR NEW INDIA @ 75-AZADI KA AMRIT MOHATSAV HELD

The 3rd State-level Committee meeting for New India @75-Azadi Ka Amrit Mohatsav was held on the 3rd June 2022 under the chairmanship of Amardeep S. Bhatia, IAS, Principal Secretary,

Health & Family Welfare and Chairman, NSACS.

The meeting was attended by representatives from the Information & Public Relations, Social Welfare, Higher Education, Technical Education, NBSE, SCERT, Youth Resources & Sports, All India Radio Kohima (AIR), Doordarshan Kendra Kohima (DDK) and PIB Kohima.

The meeting highlighted the achievements of New India @75-Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav conducted in eight high HIV prevalent districts, namely Kohima, Dimapur, Mokokchung, Noklak, Phek, Peren, Tuensang, and Kiphire in a threephased manner on three themes, namely HIV, TB and Blood donation. The District Level Committees were set up under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner in each identified district to carry out the activities.

The presentation on the overall achievements was delivered by Thejangunuo Theunuo, Deputy Director (IEC), NSACS. She highlighted that the campaign was carried out from August 2021 to March 2022 in the 75 identified schools and 75 identified colleges/institutes/Higher Secondary Schools (the 75 number each in consonance with the 75 years of India's Independence) in the identified districts. Through the awareness programme, a total of 16,264 students (vouth and adolescents) were reached. During the various competitions that were conducted (Paint your thought, Voice your thought, Publicize your thought, Film your thought, etc.), a total of 1,212 students took part and 479 students were declared winners. The publicity of the campaign was supported by DDK, AIR, PIB, and DIPR.

SOCIAL WELFARE AND STATE RESOURCE CENTRE FOR WOMEN DEPARTMENTAL REVIEW MEETING

Chief Secretary J. Alam held a departmental review meeting with the staff of the Social Welfare Department and State Resources Centre for Women on 4th June 2022 at the Chief Secretary's Conference Room, Kohima.

J. Alam asked the officials to have proper coordination among themselves, ensure better governance, set targets, give more focus and walk the extra mile to achieve the desired goals. He added that the Government is giving so many facilities to the citizens, so the role as an official is to ensure that those facilities should reach the doorsteps of the people. He advised the officials to work in coordination with other departments to ensure the development reaches out to common people. The Chief Secretary emphasized the need to have a banking account number for every citizen and asked the officials to put every head together to find the solution for any problem.

The State Resource Centre for Women since its inception has been actively working to fulfill its mission of carrying forward the mandate of the Ministry of the Women & Child Development (MWCD), Government of India which is to work towards the holistic empowerment of women through inter-sectoral convergence of schemes and programmes of the Government.

AH & VS DEPARTMENT CAPACITATES POULTRY SATELLITE FARMS

Amidst the occurrence of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the State, the demand and supply gap of pork is likely to widen during the current year 2022 as it is affecting backyard piggery farmers of the State.

Thus, to mitigate the shortage of meat in the State, the Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services is promoting Poultry farming which is having a shorter gestation period of marketing age and is also easily available and a popular menu in Naga cuisine. Accordingly, the Department capacitated 10 (ten) Poultry Satellite Farms under NEC project having a capacity of 300 Grower Birds per cycle on 10th June 2022 in the presence of Additional Secretary, Chisi Thou and Additional Director and HoD, Dr. Nsanthung Ezung.

The 10 Poultry Satellite Farms are spread across Dimapur, Chümoukedima, Peren and Nuiland districts which can rear 3000 birds and

is expected to produce 7.13 tonnes of chicken for table purpose in one cycle of production. (i.e. after 2 months of rearing).

During the formal capacitation programme, the officials present encouraged the entrepreneurs to take up the farming with sincerity and dedication and to present their problems especially in technical matter through the online platform which is already created. Issues of bulk/retail marketing, farming economic, formation of tertiary SHGs and other forward & backward linkages were also discussed with the entrepreneurs.

Project Director, Dr. Simon Ao informed the farmers that not only the Satellite Farms, but through the NEC project, other Entrepreneurs, SHGs, Societies, Women Groups etc. can avail such facilities especially fully vaccinated Poultry Birds for rearing on business mode.

DGP NAGALAND UPDATES MEDIA ON OTING FIRING INVESTIGATION

CM RIO INAUGURATES CHÜMOUKEDIMA DISTRICT

Chief Minister, Nagaland, Neiphiu Rio inaugurated the Chümoukedima district on 29th June 2022, making it the 16th district in the State.

In his address, Rio stated that Chümoukedima was historically significant as it was known as 'Samokidima' way back in 1866, and later on, when Dimapur district was created in 1997, Chümoukedima was made its headquarters.

Recalling the public opposition to shifting the DC's Office Dimapur to Chümoukedima, Rio said any differences should be peacefully settled through negotiations and for which, the government tasked all the five legislators from Dimapur headed by Deputy CM to have a consultation with the leaders and to advise the government on the matter. Accordingly, all the legislators suggested creating two new separate districts and so, the government after thorough discussion and deliberation decided to create Niuland and Chümoukedima as separate districts for the sake of administrative convenience and named Niuland the 'Land of diversity' and Chümoukedima as the 'Land of opportunities.' The CM urged the three districts to work in close coordination and stated that Dimapur CP will oversee the three districts regarding the law and order.

The CM reminded the gathering that Chümoukedima is fortunate to have wellestablished central institutions and three universities i.e. Global ICFAI and St. Joseph Universities and several good colleges in the district, adding that Chümoukedima can become the intellectual hub in the State. Nagaland being a tribal state from the beginning, many districts in the State have been created on tribal aspirations. The districts of Shamator and Tseminyu were created and Shamator has been named as the 'Land of brotherhood' and Tseminyu as the 'Historical district.'

While urging the denizens to choose the path of unity and peaceful coexistence, Rio thanked the western Sumi Hoho and Chakhroma Public Organization for ironing out the past differences and ushering peace and unity between the two tribes and appealed to other tribes to emulate the same. In regard to urban and rural local bodies, Rio made it clear that the 73rd Amendment does not apply to our State and so, the VDBs and Village Council members are selected according to our traditional practices, and reiterated that the 94th Amendment is applicable in our State and for which our traditional practices of selection cannot and will not be imposed in municipal and town council elections.

Short speeches were also delivered by Jacob Zhimomi, Minister of PHED; MLA Azheto Zhimomi; Rovilatuo Mor IAS, Commissioner, Nagaland; President, Chakhroma Public Organisation; President, Western Sumi Hoho; VCC, Chümoukedima village. Thungchio Lotha, Pastor, Lotha Baptist Church Chümoukedima, and A. Zakaria, Pastor, Chang Baptist Church Chümoukedima pronounced invocation and benediction respectively.

Nagaland was held at de-Oriental Hotel, Kohima on 9th June 2022.

Principal Secretary to the Government of Nagaland, Amardeep Singh Bhatia, IAS and Principal Director, Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Nagaland, Dr. K. Vikato Kinimi were the special guests of the event.

In his speech, Bhatia stressed the importance of early detection of any health issues and monitoring the condition on regular basis, and treating with an appropriate medical regime. Stating that Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD) are very much prevailing in the society, Bhatia stressed the need to act together at the individual, community, and government levels to ensure that NCD does not become a silent pandemic that will affect the people severely in the long run.

Presenting a PowerPoint on the campaign, CMO Kohima, Dr. Vezokholu Theyo said that with the observation of Universal Health Coverage Day on 13th December 2021, the Kohima district team decided to screen and have a comprehensive management of NCD on two common diseases i.e. hypertension and diabetes mellitus. In this connection, a sensitization programme was held on 15th January 2022 under the chairmanship of the District Health Society, the Deputy Commissioner, Kohima along with AKMWP and 19 Ward Chairmen including 50 colonies, where the Board decided to take forward the package to colonies, and held a Mini Health Camp for diabetes and hypertension, CMO informed.

Highlighting the disease prevalence in the community on the data from the co-morbid disease mapping/survey, Dr. Theyo informed that 9,243 households were surveyed across 42 colonies with 15,100 target people identified (30 years and above) where a total number of persons were identified with the following diseases: 823 persons with hypertension (5.45%), 710 with diabetes (4.70%), 55 with cancer (0.36%), 107 with kidney disease (0.71%) and 40 persons with TB (0.3%).

On the outcome of the campaign, Dr. Theyo informed that a total number of 2,429 people have availed free consultation, medicines and diagnostic services. A total of 269 (11.07%) new hypertension cases, 69 (2.84%) new diabetes cases, and 24 (0.98%) new HTN + DM were also detected among the targeted population. The follow up clients recorded hypertension - 265 (10.90%), diabetes - 120 (4.94%) and HTN + DM - 79 (3.25%). Dr. Theyo also highlighted the various general observation of the campaign and follow-up suggestions for corrective measures.

WOKHA DPDB APPROVES LADP

Wokha District Planning & Development Board (DPDB) approved the Local Area Development Programme (LADP) for the year 2022-2023, during the monthly Wokha DPDB meeting held at DC's Conference Hall, Wokha on 9th June 2022. The meeting was chaired by Deputy Commissioner (DC), Orenthung Lotha.

Intelligence Officer, NCB, Zonal Guwahati, Lunkholal who spoke on the topic 'Emerging Scenario & Challenges in the Combat Against Drug Trafficking in the NE Region: An Enforcement Perspective,' said that India's complex drug problems were due to its proximity to the two largest drug-producing region in the world, one being referred to as Golden Crescent comprising of Iran, Afghanistan, and Pakistan in the west and Golden Triangle consisting of Myanmar, Thailand, and Laos in the east. He informed that these two regions account for more than 90% of the world's main opium and heroin production.

Lunkholal said that Nagaland serves as a transit route for the trafficking of drugs from Manipur and Myanmar such as morphine, opium, brown sugar, and heroin. On emerging trends and challenges in drug trafficking, he highlighted that Indo-Myanmar has a friendly relation with no border dispute and no strict fencing of the border stretch plus Free Moving Regime (FMR) between two countries allowing free movement within 16 Km of border area without visa restrictions. This has been misused and taken advantage of by the criminal elements. He also mentioned the use of the darknet and the suspected use of drones by the traffickers.

ECO-CARP HATCHERY INAUGURATED AT WOKHA

The Eco-Carp Hatchery was set up at New Wokha village under CSS, Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) and was inaugurated on 22nd June 2022 by the Director of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources. This Hatchery though the technology concept is from the Chinese Eco-Fish Hatchery, is the first-ever indigenously built in Nagaland and it will help to cater to the demands of fish seeds, particularly in Wokha district.

Director, Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, Rongsennungba stated that the availability of quality seed of cultivable freshwater fish species has always been felt for intensification of fish production in the State. Fish seeds are indispensable and the means of obtaining them influences farm production directly. Due to limited fish seed production farms, there is lesser production of fry/fingerlings which has led to a gap in demand and supply of quality fish due to which seed is being procured annually from neighbouring states to meet the high demand for fish seeds for the State's fish farmers. The development of this project is to suffice fish seed production in the State.

Union Minister, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Narendra Singh Tomar inaugurated the Honey Laboratory at Beekeeping Mission 7th Mile Chümoukedima on 27th June 2022.

While speaking at the function, Minister, Agriculture and Cooperation, Nagaland, G. Kaito Aye stated that Nagaland state is performing well in agri and allied sector and said that the State has received Krishi Karman Award for two consecutive years for foodgrain production under the small states category. Aye said that Central Sponsored Schemes such as SMAM, RKVY, PM- KISAN, MIDH, PMKSY, etc. have benefitted the State.

The government with limited resources, initiated a start-up programme called 'Naturally Nagaland' to monetize the poor and marginal farmers in post-harvest management and marketing so that they can package their products in any brand under the banner of Naturally Nagaland. Aye also brought to the knowledge of the Central Ministry that most of the central policies and schemes are generally designed as 'one size fits all' and requested the planners and policy makers from the central ministry to visit the remote hill areas. Aye also highlighted the inconvenience faced by the farmers in the State in implementing digital online payment through PFMS, SNA accounts, DBT, etc. and said out of a total of 74 blocks in the State, 27 blocks are still unbanked. Also the staggered release of funds in four installments under PFMS affects the programme implementation of Kharif and Rabi crops. In this regard, the Minister requested the Central Ministry to reconsider and continue with the old system of release in two installments.

Aye also requested the Union Minister in setting up the AC Organic Market in the rest of the 15 districts in the State and also the construction of a common facility with all amenities for the state, national and international levels under one roof.

Meanwhile, Chief Secretary, J. Alam said that 2/3rd of the State population lives in rural areas and is engaged in agri and allied activities that give a large potential for commercial production of various crops, however, we are yet to fully realize our potential due to several challenges. Realizing that the traditional system of jhum cultivation is neither economically viable nor ecological sustainable, the State Government has adopted the Naga Integrated Settled Farming (N-IsF) and is successfully implementing a pilot project in some parts of the State, he stated.

The Chief Secretary stated that as per the advice and direction from the Central Ministry, the State Government along with the ICAR will be establishing a State Agriculture Research Station (SARS) at Yisemyong Mokokchung and Regional Livestock Centre for Pigs in Zunheboto. The Government is also focussing on the supply of quality seeds to increase the volume of production and for marketing linkages or buyback arrangements to enable farmers to get remunerative prices, and assured that the State Government is fully committed to developing the agri and allied sector as per the national priorities.
