## CABINET'S DECISION ON SUPERANNUATION AGE OF MEDICAL DCOTORS

The Cabinet has taken a decision to raise the superannuation age of all medical doctors, including AYUSH and Dental doctors, from 60 to 62 years of age through re-employment as a consultant/senior consultant/specialist to work in the hospitals and clinics. The willing superannuating medical officers opting for the extension will be allowed to join without interview but will be screened for physical fitness etc.

The Cabinet also decided to create 60 new posts, including 1 post of Director, 1 post of Medical Superintendent, 6 posts of Professor, 22 posts of Associate Professor and 25 posts of Tutors/Senior Residents for the Medical College at Kohima. The faculty can be engaged against these posts, beyond the normal superannuation age, on re-employment basis by the NIMSR Society (which was constituted earlier during the year for the Kohima Medical College) up to 65 years. Furthermore, in exceptional circumstances where such skills are not otherwise available, appointments may be made beyond 65 years and up to 70 years also by the Society.

In taking these decisions, the Cabinet was guided by the pronouncement made in the Prime Minister's speech at Saharanpur on May 26, 2016, and the decisions taken by the Central Government subsequently. The gist of these are as given below:

1. The Prime Minister had stated that the superannuation age of the doctors who are in Government hospitals, irrespective of whether it is 60 years or 62 years, would be increased, at the central and the state government level, from 62 to 65 years so that the services of these doctors are available for a longer time for teaching and government hospitals.
2. The Central Government issued an order dated 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016 enhancing the age of superannuation of various categories of Medical Officers of the Central Health Service (CHS) to 65 years. It was clarified by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare that the Order is applicable to CHS only and the State Governments and others may take a decision to enhance the age of superannuation of doctors to 65 years, as per their requirements and circumstances.
3. During the extended period, the Medical Officers are placed in non-administrative positions, and extension is given only if they exercise the option of posting to teaching/ clinical/patient care/implementation of health programmes/public health programmes and functions and other areas/functions including advisory and consultancy etc. depending on their expertise and experience.

### The Cabinet's decisions:

1. Will allow Medical Officers who want to serve the public further through Government Hospitals or Teaching Hospitals to continue to do so up to 62 years and 70 years respectively.
2. Will not in any way block promotional avenues of any of the junior officers.
3. Will not in any way block recruitment posts for new Graduate/PG doctors.
4. Will increase budgetary allocation towards healthcare vis-à-vis the overall budget of the State.

The Cabinet also noted that Nagaland Public Service Commission (NPSC) has been requested to take up recruitment against 108 requisitioned posts expeditiously even though almost all the posts are currently manned by doctors engaged on contractual basis.

## SCHOOL EDUCATION CLARIFIES ON HINDI IMPOSITION ROW

With reference to media reports regarding the Hindi imposition row citing the statement of the Union Home Minister, Amit Shah that all the eight North East States have agreed to make Hindi compulsory up to Class X, Principal Director, School Education, Shanavas C, IAS through a press release has clarified that:

The State of Nagaland follows three language formula up to class VIII and Hindi is offered as a compulsory language subject up to class 8. In classes 9 & 10, the students have the liberty to study either Hindi or any Modern Indian Language (Ao/Bengali/Lotha/Sumi/Tenyidie) or Alternative English as the Second Language.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 advocates adopting three language policy up to secondary, but it does not impose any language on states. As per NEP 2020, the three languages learned by children will be the choices of states, regions and the students themselves. The timeline for the implementation of NEP 2020 is within 2030 and the Ministry of Education has not issued any instructions for making Hindi compulsory in the secondary stage.

Policy No. 4.13 of the NEP 2020, which describes the three language policy, is reproduced below:

‘4.13: The three language formula will continue to be implemented while keeping in mind the Constitutional provisions, aspirations of the people, regions, and the Union, and the need to promote multilingualism as well as promote national unity. However, there will be greater flexibility in the three language formula, and no language will be imposed on any state. The three languages learned by the children will be the choices of states, regions and the students themselves, so long as at least two of the three languages are native to India. In particular, students who wish to change one or more of the three languages they are studying may do so in Grade 6 or 7, as long as they can demonstrate basic proficiency in three languages (including one language of India at the literature level) by the end of secondary school.’

Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department has stated that the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG), Government of India, intends to improve the grievance redressal machinery by integration of the public grievances of State Portal with CPGRAMS under "One Nation One Portal" to minimize the multiple log in problems. In this respect, each department needs to be integrated with the district level offices to serve as a single window interface for lodging complaints.

To expedite the process of integration, all the Administrative Heads of Department/Heads of Departments have been requested to take the following action positively:

1. Every AHoD/HoD/Subsidiary Offices shall assign a separate Nodal Officer for Public Grievances, at the Administrative/Head/Subsidiary and District Offices.
2. In the District level, the Deputy Commissioners will nominate the District Nodal Officer for Public Grievances to interface with every District Level Office for ensuring timely redressal of the grievances in coordination with agencies concerned.

The name of the assigned Nodal Officer for Public Grievances at the Administrative/Head/Subsidiary/District Offices along with all the necessary particulars may kindly be furnished to the Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department at an early date for further necessary action.

## ASSETS AND LIABILITIES OF THE ERSTWHILE NIRMISC LTD. TRANSFERRED TO THE GOVERNMENT OF NAGALAND

## SCHOOL EDUCATION INFORMS ON VIDYANJALI

In consonance with the vision of National Education Policy, 2020, to involve volunteers under various programmes and catalyze interaction between students and volunteers by extensive use of technology and community outreach, the Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Education has launched Vidyanjali, a volunteer management programme, which will benefit crores of students of government schools across the country.

Government Schools shall register on the Vidyanjali portal (<https://vidyanjali.education.gov.in/>) and post a list of required service/activity or assets/material/equipment on the web portal/app depending upon the number of students and their requirements, physical infrastructure available, availability of human resources and other resources on the school.

A volunteer can participate in the programme by registering on Vidyanjali portal and contributing to the identified list of services/activities and/or assets/materials/equipments in schools of their choice. The broad categories of contribution cover services ranging from subject assistance, the teaching of art & crafts, yoga & sports, and vocational skills to mentoring of students for career counseling and sponsoring of events/camps at schools and further cover support for basic civil infrastructure, electrical infrastructure, digital infrastructure, equipment for extra-curricular activities & sports, teaching-learning materials/equipment maintenance, and repairs, etc.

Heads of all Government Schools have been informed to register on the Vidyanjali portal and make the best use of the programme. Further, School Heads shall designate a suitable staff as School Vidyanjali Coordinator and submit his particulars (Name, Designation, Mobile Number, Email Address) through the DoSE Online School Monitoring Portal.

Detailed Guidelines and a User Manual are available at the Vidyanjali portal.

## H&FW NOTIFIES ON COMMUNICATION BY GOVERNMENT SERVANTS TO THE PRESS

Health & Family Welfare Department has issued an Order which states about inviting attention to Nagaland Government Servant (Conduct) Rules, 1958 which prohibits government servants from broadcasting or publishing or any communication to the press or public utterance of any statement of fact or opinion not connected with the discharge of official duty, without prior government sanction.

The doctors in government service have been requested to take kind note of the above and refrain from engaging in any activity or communication in violation of the Nagaland Government Servant (Conduct) Rules, 1968. Any violation of the same shall attract disciplinary proceedings against the Government Servants under the conduct rules.

## BAN ON SINGLE-USE PLASTICS IN NAGALAND

In partial modification to the Department's Notification NO.UDD/7-GEN/07/2018 dated 29.11.2018 and 17.06.2019 and in pursuance to "Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules 2021 notified by the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India Notification NO.GSR NO.571 (E) on 12.08.2021 in the Gazette of India prohibiting identified Single-Use Plastic items, which have low utility and high littering potential, by 2022, the Government of Nagaland has imposed a 'Ban on Single-Use Plastics in Nagaland' with a view to eradicate the menace of plastic and the serious environmental and ecological challenges posed by rampant use of plastics.

The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale, and use of carry bags made of virgin or recycled plastic shall not be less than 75 (seventy-five) microns in thickness w.e.f. the 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and 120 (one hundred and twenty) microns in thickness w.e.f. the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022. Further, a non-woven plastic carry bag shall not be less than 60 Gram Per Square Meter (GSM) w.e.f. 30<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale, and use of following single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022:

- (a) Earbuds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene (thermocool) for decoration;
- (b) Plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straws, trays, wrapping or packaging films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or Poly-Vinyl Chloride (PVC) banners less than 100 micron, stirrers.

All other clauses mandated in the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 and Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021 should be strictly adhered to.

All individuals, institutions, and commercial establishments (educational institutions, offices, hotels, shops, restaurants, religious institutions/faith-based institutions, industrial establishments, banquet halls, etc.) and Central & State Government Departments/Agencies/Commissions/PSUs/Missions, etc. including Militaries/Para-militaries in the State shall abide by the aforesaid ban and any breach shall be liable for penalties.

The District Administration & Sub-Divisional Administration/Urban Local Bodies shall decide and levy penalties against the defaulters in their jurisdiction.

A District Task Force already constituted in the respective district shall strictly monitor and function as squads for vigilance purposes and ensure the imposing of the ban on stocking, distribution, selling, and use of all single-use plastics below the permissible specification (microns and GSM) and stipulated timelines.

The ban on single-use plastics shall be made effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the Official Gazette in the entire State of Nagaland.

### **DEPARTMENTAL REVIEW MEETING HELD WITH HIGHER EDUCATION AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION**

Departmental review meeting was held with the Department of Higher Education and Technical Education at the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall, Kohima on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2022.

PowerPoint presentations were made by

both the Departments highlighting their organization structure, mandates, activities, achievements, challenges, and future initiatives. The Department of Technical Education informed that there are seven functioning polytechnics in the State with an enrolment

of 742 students during 2021-22, availing various courses in technical and vocational education and training. The Department also stated that plans to introduce new Programmes/Courses such as Food Processing Technology, Diploma in Pharmacy, Tourism, etc. in the polytechnics to diversify educational opportunities and enhance the employability of the youth.

The Department of Technical Education informed that it has successfully selected and nominated candidates to study Medical and allied courses, Engineering, and Agri and allied courses purely on the merit basis through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET), Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Mains and Nagaland State Entrance Examination (NSEE). A total number of 549 candidates have been nominated to various Agri & Para-Medical Courses (NSEE), Engineering Courses (JEE), MBBS, BDS & Allied Courses (NEET) and Diploma Courses both within and outside the State during the academic session 2021-22.

The Department of Higher Education stated that there are 15 Government Colleges in Nagaland and is producing around 7000 graduates every year. The Department also highlighted that the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) shall be

introduced in all the affiliating HEIs from the 2022 academic session onward. CBCS consists of credit-based courses such as Disciplinary Major and Minor, Inter-disciplinary Major and Minor, Vocational/ Skill Courses, Project Works in Community Engagement and Service, Environmental Education, Value-based education. The Department also informed that the concept note on the implementation of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) of the State has been prepared by the Department and submitted to the Ministry of Education (HE), Government of India.

Chief Secretary, J. Alam, IAS in his concluding remarks, stated that the way of functioning of both Higher Education and Technical Education is different from other Government Departments and people expect the two departments to come up with new innovative ideas and bring positive change in the education system in the State. He observed that good initiatives are being taken up by both the departments and encouraged them to continue the good performance. Alam also said that the National Education Policy 2020 should be properly understood and called for its successful implementation in the State.

World Autism Day was celebrated at Jo Foundation Inclusive School, Kohima on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2022 with State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Diethono Nakhro as the guest speaker.

Diethono Nakhro said this year's theme for World Autism Awareness Day 'Inclusive quality education for all,' was chosen to draw attention to the disruption of education especially for autistic children due to the pandemic. Despite the numerous constraints that exist, she appreciated the Inclusive School for providing quality education to the children. Nakhro said disability has been a neglected sector, not only by the government but by the society. Fortunately, there are improvements taking place, and conversations on disability in various sectors are now visible, she added. She maintained that awareness is not enough and the goal is Autism acceptance.

Daniel Thong Solo, Chairman of Jo Foundation Inclusive School said Autism is a disorder that hampers communication and

social skills. Autistic people are not able to express their feelings and they have problems understanding other people's feelings. He also explained that there are different degrees of autism: mild, moderate, and severe and early intervention is essential for providing support to autistic people which will give them a better quality of life. Support and therapy can help manage the challenges that ASD poses. Solo said he and his wife started the Inclusive School to help children who are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) like their son.

Jo Foundation Inclusive School is looking after 34 special needs children with Autism, Down Syndrome, ADHD, intellectual learning disability, speech and hearing impaired, locomotor disability, and dwarfism. 'Kung-fu demo' and 'Colourful rainbow' were displayed by the Jo Foundation students, a special presentation was given by St. Joseph College, Jakhama, and a speech on 'Journey of an affected parent' was given by Vincent Belho.

**STATE-LEVEL SPECIAL REVENUE TEAM OF  
POWER DEPARTMENT HOLDS MEETING**

The State-level Special Revenue Team of Power Department held a meeting for the 2021-22 FY at the office of SLDC, Nagarjan (Kuda), Dimapur on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2022.

Joint Secretary, Power, Sara S. Jamir, who is also the team leader for State Level Special Revenue Team of Power Department, in her opening remarks, said with the improvement of revenue collection, she believed that the department could provide better power supply to consumers in the days to come. Power being a service sector, priority should be given to providing good service to the consumers, she

added.

On the revenue collection, the Team Leader congratulated Team Dimapur and Chumoukedima for achieving Rs. 102 crore jointly. She commended the Dimapur and Chumoukedima Divisions for collecting more than 50% against the rest of the state revenue collection during the Financial Year 2021-22. She encouraged the two divisions to keep up with the momentum and work towards achieving 100% of the revenue target in the coming years, keeping in mind the satisfaction of consumers.

**CONSULTATIVE MEETING ON AFSPA HELD AT CHUMOUKEDIMA**

A consultative meeting with Tribal Hohos and Organizations was held at Rhododendron Hall, Chumoukedima on 4<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Chief Secretary, Nagaland, J. Alam, IAS welcomed all the members and briefed them that after almost three decades, AFSPA (Armed Forces Special Powers Act) has been lifted from certain areas of Nagaland. AFSPA has been removed completely in 3(three) districts and partially removed in 4 (four) districts of Nagaland and he expressed hope that further progress will be seen in the days to come.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio said all stakeholders had appealed for the abolishment of the draconian law - AFSPA, and the Government of India has finally heard the appeals of the people. He said the State Government had formed a 22-Member Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe the Oting incident. He congratulated the members of the SIT for their prompt action in conducting investigations and submitting their

preliminary reports. Once the report is submitted and a case is filed, the contents of the report will be made known to the public. The Centre also formed its SIT and they have also submitted their report, he added.

Rio said total abolition of AFSPA may take time but the partial AFSPA abolishment is a test. During this crucial period, he stated that if law and order cannot be controlled, AFSPA may be reinstated, and appealed for co-operation with the Government to ensure that no untoward incidents occur. As the Naga solution is for all the Nagas, he appealed that the Nagas should harbor a sense of unity and oneness and not be selfish in their demands. He thanked the CSOs, Tribal leaders, and student bodies for always cooperating and supporting the Government.

Chairman, UDA, T. R. Zeliang stated that partial lifting of AFSPA is an experimental phase with the end goal of completely removing AFSPA from the State. He appealed for joint

responsibility and co-operation as the police would be handicapped without the peoples' support.

Home Commissioner, Abhijit Sinha, IAS said earlier notification on AFSPA issued in December 2021 has been withdrawn and fresh notification has been issued on the same. Out of 72 Police Stations, AFSPA has been withdrawn in 15 Police Stations. This can be seen as the first step toward the total abolition of AFSPA in the State. He stated that tribal leaders, leaders of apex bodies, Hohos, CSOs, and student bodies will have to play an important role and will have to take responsibility for keeping the peace as AFSPA may be reinstated if law and order problems arise. This is a combined responsibility

of all stakeholders involved, he added.

DGP, John Longklumer, IPS maintained that once AFSPA is removed, the responsibility of law and order, and maintaining peace will fall on the Nagaland Police. He informed that IRB personnel have been deployed at strategic locations to ensure the maintenance of law and order.

The Eastern Naga Students Federation appealed for total justice to be delivered to all victims of the Oting incident and that the GoN should remind the GoI in this regard. ENSF is still in non-cooperation with armed forces and will continue to do so until justice is delivered. Other tribal bodies also shared their opinions during the meeting.

### **MEDIA PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT SIGNED TO PROMOTE WELFARE OF WORKERS**

The Nagaland Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board (NBOCWWB) along with the Directorate of Information & Public Relations and Kohima Press Club launched a media partnership agreement at Hotel Vivor, Kohima on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Chairman of NBOCWWB, Kekhrie Yhome said the partnership with the two organizations came about because DIPR has been consistently carrying out public relations and publicity work and the KPC has the talent for investigative journalism. He mentioned that the time was right for a first-of-its-kind collaboration with the DIPR and the Press.

Joint Director, IPR, Asangla Imsong, and President, KPC, Alice Yhoshü signed the Media Partnership Agreement on behalf of DIPR and KPC. They expressed appreciation to Yhome for developing the idea of collaboration to promote the welfare of the workers.

The objectives of the partnership are

to encourage collaboration between tangent establishments and support each other's obligation to public services; to promote public interest and highlight sectoral focus on workers associated with building and other constitution activities; and to publicize NBOCWWB's activities and mandate, particularly on social justice schemes and welfare benefits.

DIPR was given the responsibility to produce two short documentaries - a below 90 seconds clip highlighting NBOCWWB's welfare benefits and schemes, and a below 10 minutes clip strictly related to trends, status, and conditions of buildings and other construction workers.

KPC would initiate, innovate and institute fellowships or awards against any medium of mass communication provided the objective is strictly related to trends and conditions of building and other construction workers.

NBOCWWB would provide financial assistance for the execution of the works.

Later on, the Angamis worked together with the Britishers when Kohima was made the headquarter. He also pointed out that amongst the 21 signatories of the Simon Commission, 15 were from the Angami tribe who represented the Nagas, and the forefathers sacrificed and contributed greatly to the Naga movement, which he stated is one reason why the Angamis have been blessed.

Rio added that many things may still be lacking but the unity, integrity, and the good practices of their forefathers have helped the Angami community to date. He exhorted the younger generation to continue the legacy so that through them, not just the Angamis but the

whole Naga society will be blessed. Pointing out the motto of APO 'Right is Might,' Rio called upon the gathering to uphold it so that there will be progress in the society. He stressed the need to stay united and achieve greater things.

All the 104 Angami Village Chairmen and the four Angami Range Presidents hoisted their respective flags. The Jubilee flag and APO flag were hoisted by Neiphiu Rio and Razouvotuo Chatsu respectively. The Golden Jubilee celebration brought around 20,000 Angami people together from all walks of life to foster better understanding and unity by sharing food cooked from a common hearth.

APO President, Razouvotuo Chatsu, first APO President, Zapuvisie Lhousa also spoke on the occasion. Executive Director, ABCC, Rev. Dr. V. Atsi Dolie invoked God's blessings. The welcome address was delivered by Convenor, Organising Committee, K. Neibou Sekhose. Angami Women Organisation, Southern Angami Cultural Society, and Angami Youth Organization presented folk songs and dances. Special songs were presented by Angami Students Union, Angami Gazetted Officers Krotho, Menguseü Suokhrie, Atso Chasie, and Methaneilie Jütakhrie. A unity dance was also performed by the gathering.

### STATE-LEVEL WORKSHOP ON SDGs HELD

A state-level workshop on NER District SDG Index 2.0, SDG India Index, 2021-22, and Multidimensional Poverty Index was held at Capital Convention Centre, Kohima on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Advisor, Industries & Commerce, Labour & Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Imnatiba in his keynote

address, said that Nagaland is making consistent progress in SDG Index, which focuses on state-level performance. He added that the compulsive score for Nagaland improved from 57 in 2019 to 61 in 2021 and the State is ranked 19<sup>th</sup> among 35 States and Union Territories of the country. He stated that going by the North Eastern Region District SDG Index, some of the districts of

Nagaland are doing fairly well in certain goals such as zero hunger, clean water and sanitation, quality education, and gender equality. However, he said that more works need to be done for bottom-ranked districts and on some indicators at the State level.

Imnatiba mentioned that the Nagaland SDG Vision 2030, which was launched by Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio in August 2021, provides specific targets with measurable indicators and strategies to meet the aspirations of the people and to translate the Nagaland SDG Vision 2030 into reality. He also said, with the technical support of the UNDP and active collaboration from various departments of the State, the SDG Coordination Centre of the Planning Department, Government of Nagaland, is already making rapid strides towards achieving the goals.

Regional Head-North East India, UNDP John Borgoyary, in his address stated that UNDP is closely partnering with the Government of Nagaland and it will soon initiate a CSR initiative which will be part of the SDG Coordination Center under the Planning Department. The aim will be to tap resources from the private sector and other development partners. He added it will particularly be targeting those areas under SDGs.

Borgoyary informed that UNDP is partnering with the Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Nagaland on Universalization of Immunization. Highlighting the Electronic Vaccine Intelligence Network (eVIN), which is a software application developed in partnership with the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, he said the programme is being implemented

in all the states of India. He also said that the programme has strengthened the health care system, especially in terms of addressing issues relating to immunization. He also said that as part of the eVIN, it has developed a COVID application in partnership with the Government of India and has been helping the Government of India and the Government of Nagaland in monitoring and managing COVID vaccinations.

Mimansa Mishra, Associate (SDG), NITI Aayog gave a presentation on SDG India Index 2020-21; NER District SDG Index 2020-21, and context setting on Version 2.0 and National Multidimensional Poverty Index. The State Planning Department gave a presentation on the progress of SDG localization. A presentation on the goal and indicator-wise presentation was given by NITI Aayog and discussed with the departments on SDG India Index 4.0.

Technical session on NER District SDG Index 2.0 SDG 1-8 and SDG 9-16: Presentation on Draft NER SDG Indicator Framework 2.0 on SDGs; concepts, methodology, definitions, and computations, discussion with State Departments on district-wise data reporting and challenges were also conducted. The Department of Economics & Statistics, Nagaland launched the Online Registration of Births and Deaths, Nagaland at the Directorate Kohima on 19<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Director, Economic & Statistics, Nagaland, Neidilhou Angami while launching the online application, said the Department had desired to have the online application facility for a long time and the launching of the application is an achievement for the Department. He said the registration of births and deaths is being implemented through the Registration of Births and

Deaths Act 1969 and Nagaland Correspondence Rule 1999, and to keep the pace of the ID regulation and on public demand, the Office of the Registrar General of India has come up with the software to enable the people to obtain online certificates. The main objective of the software is to facilitate and streamline the citizen service delivery system which has two purposes - to enable the public to apply, obtain death and birth certificates and to manage and record data.

The Director also highlighted that at present, two registrars are activated, one at the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Nagaland, and the other at the District Economics & Statistics Office Kohima to have online registration of birth and death certificates, and the department in a phase-wise manner will also take up this facility in the coming days to all the district offices and all the 1465 registrars in the rural areas of the State. With the launching of the software application, he said, the general public and consumers will be able to have a convenient way to obtain birth and death certificates.

### SEMINAR HELD ON SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION IN INDIA 2.0 AND NEP 2020

The inaugural programme of a national seminar on Social Transformation in India 2.0 and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was held at the Nagaland University, Kohima Campus, Meriema on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2022. The two-day seminar was sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Science Research and organized by the Department of Teacher Education (DTE), Nagaland University, Kohima Campus, Meriema.

Member, NEP Committee and Vice-Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi University of Horticulture and Forestry, Chattisgarh, Prof. Ram Shankar Kureel highlighted the Vision of NEP 2020, which he mentioned is to establish an education system that contributes to an equitable and vibrant knowledge society by providing high-quality education to all, developing a sense of respect towards the fundamental rights, duties, and constitutional values, etc. and to instill skills, values and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable de-

velopment and living, and global well-being. He said the key principles of NEP 2020 are respect for diversity and local context in all curriculum, pedagogy, and policy; equity and inclusion as the cornerstone of all education-

al decisions; encouragement and facilitation for philanthropic, private, and community participation; use of technology in teaching and learning etc.

Director, Department of Higher Education, Dr. Katoni Jakhalu said whether we are ready or not, we are at the threshold of tremendous changes, especially in the education sector. Highlighting the State's higher education, she stated that a Task Force was constituted to make a recommendation for the implementation of the policy. She said that to create awareness, seminars and workshops were conducted online and offline, and attempts were made to spread awareness about the guidelines of NEP 2020 in different local Naga dialects, but so far, only Tenyidie has completed the translated version.

When it comes to key areas and agenda on equity in NEP 2020, Dr. Katoni stated that the State is well balanced in gender parity, in higher



education, female student enrollment for the last two years is more than their male counterpart. She stated that so far, out of 69 affiliated colleges under NU, 40% are NAAC accredited. She said that the State's policy is to establish at least one government college in each district, tuition fees are subsidized and proper facilities, smart classrooms, digitalized libraries are provided to ensure that no one is left out in digital learning and technology, but with the creation of five new districts, she stated that the task ahead is a challenging one. She maintained that huge gaps and perplexing challenges are ahead but as long as there is dialogue and exchange of ideas, the education sector of the State will progress with the rest of India.

Pro Vice-Chancellor, Nagaland University, Prof. A. K. Mishra said for the social transfor-

mation of the country, equal opportunities need to be provided for which education is fundamental. He added that teachers have an important part to play in the successful implementation of the NEP 2020 policy.

Dean, School of Humanities & Education, NU, Prof. Buno Zetsuvi said NEP 2020 envisages a great social change by transforming the educational system, however, she expressed her concern that India being a diverse country, it will not be possible to bring one whole relevant, perfect, acceptable policy suitable for the entire country, and added that flexibility and adjustments without disrupting the main aim of the policy are required. She lauded the organizers of the seminar, as through it, deliberations can be held for what is best for all the stakeholders.

## IMCT VISITS DISTRICTS ACROSS THE STATE TO ASSESS DROUGHT

### ZUNHEBOTO:

The Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) visited the Zunheboto district for assessment in wake of the drought during Kharif and Rabi on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2022.

During the team's visit, the departments of Agriculture, Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, Soil & Water Conservation, and PHED gave PowerPoint presentations on the steps they took during the drought-like situation in the district. The team assessed and inquired about how the departments handled the situation.

The IMCT included Dr. Jintu Das, Joint Director, DJD Kolkata; Vijay KR Teotia, Regional Director, Fisheries; and Mahesh Kumar, Deputy Director, Expenditure, Finance Commission Division. They were accompanied by Khrolou Koza Lohe, AM(T&E) NSDMA Home,

Temsuwangshi, AM(R&P) NSDMA Home and various Nodal Liaison Officers.

The visiting team also visited Zungti village and Shiyepu village. The Central Team also visited Mokokchung on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2022.

### WOKHA:

Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) visited Wokha district on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2022 at Hammock Resort for the assessment of the situation in the wake of drought during Kharif and Rabi 2021. The meeting was chaired by the Deputy Commissioner, Wokha & DDMA, Chairman, Orenthung Lotha.

District Agriculture Officer Wokha, highlighted the drought like situations in Wokha district through the PowerPoint presentation, and the line departments had an interaction with the Team.

The Ralan villagers presented their grievances faced during the drought period. The Team, Deputy Commissioner, and officials went for site visit at New Wokha village and interacted with the villagers.

#### **PEREN:**

An Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) led by Advisor, Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Ruchika Gupta along with Under Secretary, Ministry of Rural Development, Deep Shikhar Singhal, and Research Officer, Sansad Marg, Dr. Md. Faisal Abdullah visited Peren district on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022 and held a brief meeting at Jalukie with Administrative Officers and various Heads of Departments to take stock of the drought-like situation in the district.

During the meeting, the Department of Agriculture, PHED, and Fisheries & Aquatic Resources through a presentation apprised the visiting officials of the ground realities that the departments have faced during the drought-like situation in the district.

The team also conducted field inspections at Mhainamtsi, New Jalukie, and Nkwareu village. The Central Team also visited Niuland.

#### **KOHIMA:**

The Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) on their visit to Kohima district had a briefing with the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) and line departments at DC's Office Kohima on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022.

The Team was led by Director CWC Sudhir Kumar, Under Secretary, Food and PD, Krishi Bhawan, Ram Chandra, Assistant Director, MNCF/DA, FW, Dr. Pradeep Kumar.

The Team said the purpose of their visit is to assess the drought situation in Nagaland

and requested the Agri and PHE departments to develop an action plan prior to the monsoon and reoccurrence of drought-like situation in Kohima district to assist the farmers in the cultivation in case of delayed or no rain, which would affect the cultivated plots and ultimately result in the loss of economy for the farmers. It also requested the departments to assist sustainable resources of water throughout the year not only in Kohima town but to rural people as well. Further, the Team requested the Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services to have preparedness in case of drought and epidemic situations in the State.

DDMA Kohima highlighted drought-like situations in the State and drought mitigation measures undertaken during 2021. Measures to mitigate water scarcity in Kohima town undertaken by PHED, Urban Division Kohima were also highlighted. DDMA also highlighted the 1465.4 acres of agricultural crops affected by the drought situation during 2020-2021 in Kohima district, where 65 villages mostly from northern areas were reported to be affected.

Deputy Commissioner and DDMA Chairman, Gregory Thejawelie IAS also spoke at the meeting. The officials from the departments of Agriculture, Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, PHE, Rural Development, Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services and Land Resource also attended the meeting.

After the briefing, the Team along with DDMA officials and line departments visited the drought-hit site at Gariphema village, Kohima for spot verification under the initiatives of DDMA. They interacted with the farmers and encouraged them to upgrade their cultivating system. It was informed that 30-40 households in the village were affected by the drought.

**CS CALLS FOR DIGITALIZATION OF GOVERNMENT FUNCTIONING**

The departmental review meeting with the Department of Information Technology & Communication and the Department of Power was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022 at the Chief Secretary's Conference Hall.

The Department of Information Technology & Communication gave a detailed PowerPoint presentation regarding the activities currently being undertaken and shared a few infrastructure and capital shortage issues that the Department is facing which in turn is greatly affecting the service output. The Department also highlighted the issue of non-availability of real time data and information and regular updates from certain departments as a cause for concern when it comes to maintaining the official portal of the State Government and also in providing regular updates and information to the general public.

Apart from these, the Department of IT&C also shared some of the important activities currently being undertaken by the department like the State Data Centre which hosts the websites and applications of 70 departments, the online Inner Line Permit, Common Service Centres across the State, etc. One of the most important outcomes of the meeting was the proposal made by the Chief Secretary and his

team to phase out the manual process of issuing Inner Line Permit and Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Certificates and to make the whole process digital within a time period of three to four months. Chief Secretary, J. Alam commended the IT & C Department for all the good work it was doing and urged upon the officers of the Department to further continue to bring new developments and innovations to the working of the State Government.

The Department of Power presented a very detailed report of its activities and projects currently being undertaken and also projects that are yet to be approved. The Department also expressed that the biggest problem it was facing is the shortage of manpower in carrying out maintenance work which is in fact, one of the most vital functions of the Department. One major point discussed in detail during the meeting was the purchase of power at very high rates from certain power sources. The Department also highlighted some of the new solar plant projects that it will be undertaking in the coming months. In conclusion, Chief Secretary J. Alam also commended the Power Department for relatively improving the power situation in the State and also in improving the power purchase and revenue generation deficit.

**JAPANESE DELEGATION CALLS ON CS**

A three-member Japanese delegation to Nagaland in connection with the World War-II Remains Recovery Project called on the Chief Secretary of Nagaland, J. Alam, IAS in his office on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022.

The delegation expressed gratitude to the State Government for the cooperation and support rendered to Japan in locating the remains of fallen Japanese soldiers during WW-II. The team also

briefed the State Chief Secretary on the progress made during past years. They also informed that the team will be taking samples of the collected remains to Japan for DNA testing in order to identify the remains.

Alam assured the delegation of support and cooperation from the State Government. Nagaland Home Commissioner and other senior State Government officials were also present at the meeting.

## UNION MINISTER ARJUN MUNDA VISITS KIPHIRE

Union Minister for Tribal Affairs, Arjun Munda visited Kiphire Aspirational District on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022 and held a meeting at DC's Conference Hall, Kiphire.

In his address, Munda said that there should be all round development stating that Prime Minister, Narendra Modi has set up Aspirational District with an aim to develop most backward districts in the country for overall progress. He urged the District Officers to work hard to get good rank in Aspirational District for development in the district. He also highlighted on the importance of Health and Education sector.

PowerPoint presentations were delivered by Executive Engineer, PWD (R&B), District Welfare Officer, Executive Engineer, PHED, Chief Medical Officer, Executive Engineer, Water Resources, Project Director, DRDA, District Agriculture Officer, District Sericulture Officer and District Administration.

Minister for Soil & Water Conservation and Geology & Mining, V. Kashiho Sangtam

shared the grievances faced by the people of Kiphire district and appealed for more development.

The first day of the workshop included sessions on Emerging Cyber Crimes and

Threats, Technical & Legal Challenges in Cyber Space by Ashok Dohare, and sessions on IT Act, attribution of Digital Evidence & Appreciation of Digital Evidence by ASA Krishnan.

On the second day, Er. Lanuwabang, Director, NIELIT Kohima highlighted the facilities and services offered by the NIELIT Kohima, which was followed by topics on Digital Forensic and Mobile Forensic, Cyber Security Policy by the resource persons.

Altogether, 54 senior police officers of Nagaland Police attended the workshop.

**AH & VS DISTRIBUTES SHEEP AND GOATS UNDER  
NATIONAL LIVESTOCK MISSION**

The Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services distributed sheep and goats to the farmers under the National Livestock Mission. This scheme is being launched in a few districts with the objective to introduce rearing of sheep and goat as a low investment but fast remunerative way of farming. As the meat consumption in the State is very high,

the Department stated that it will also be an alternative source of meat for the consumers.

The animals were handed to the respective district officials by Dr. Nsanthung Ezung, Additional Director & HoD, Directorate of AH & VS, Nagaland in the presence of officials from the Directorate and District CVOs.

**NSDMA ORGANISES TWO-DAY WORKSHOP**

The inaugural programme of the two-day workshop on 'Strengthening Community Resilience to Climate Change & Disaster Risk' was held at Hotel Vivor, Kohima on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The workshop was organized by the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA), Home Department, Government of Nagaland in collaboration with InsuResilience Solutions (Frankfurt School of Finance and Management), Swiss Re and Tata AIG.

Advisor, NSDMA, Kazheto Kinimi addressing the workshop, stated that the Government through its various policies and efforts have been working towards mainstreaming the concepts of Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Climate Change Adaptation into policy making, planning and implementation. He said that the process of measuring risk and resilience is a complex task which requires detailed scientific analysis of risk and vulnerability of different areas. However, he said that such studies will help in developing realistic strategies for disaster prevention and mitigation in the State. The Advisor expressed hope that the workshop will help in understanding the issues better, help in coordination between various departments, and

strengthen community resilience to climate and disaster risks.

Joint Chief Executive Officer, NSDMA, Home Department, Johnny Ruangmei stated that the objective of the workshop is to bring out a plan and after approval by the Administrative Heads, Chief Secretary, and the Government, it will be sent as a policy document. It will also bring out a DRR in ecotourism which will aim to be the first state in India to have a disaster policy on ecotourism. The workshop also aims to help understand the Prime Minister's Ten Point Agenda for Disaster Risk Reduction, develop understanding on the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030, and work towards achieving SDG for DRR, mainstream DRR component into a development programme of each line departments, NGOs in responding to DRR. He also stressed on the need for each department to allocate a budget for disaster risk reduction for itself, which he stated is provided under the 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission provision.

Eugen Doce from InsuResilience Solutions (ISF) delivering the keynote address, said that the IPCC Report should also be included in textbooks in elementary schools, and



that it will also help the stakeholders to address the issues of climate change. He stated that three years ago, the ISF was launched since there was gap in climate risks insurance. He stated that insurance is an area that will help in fortifying the local authority, governments in the next two decades. Eugen shared that among the first presentations/submissions the ISF received was from Nagaland for funding, and in 2019, after meeting with Johnny Ruangmei in Dhaka, the ISF decided to fund the project which was submitted.

ISF's mission is to support innovative solutions to mitigate negative impacts of climate change. It fosters the development of needs-based and financially sustainable climate risk

insurance products in developing and emerging countries, increasing the resilience of poor and vulnerable households against extreme weather events and natural catastrophes. It is an important contribution of the German Government funded by KfW Development Bank to achieve the target of the international initiative on climate risk insurance 'InsuResilience.'

Welcome address was delivered by Home Commissioner, Nagaland, Abhijit Sinha IAS. The technical session on the first day of workshop were on the topics - Insurance mechanism against extreme weather events, challenges in the context of climate change and DRR in Nagaland, and policy praxis of disaster management.

### NBSE CONDUCTS SCHOOL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

A one-day School Leadership Programme was organized by Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022 at Don Bosco Higher Secondary School, Kohima. The programme was designed to improve the Learning and Teaching practices in the schools and empower the Principals and Headmasters to implement the key recommendations of the New Educational Policy. The training programme also dwelt on upgrading the skills for better management of their schools. Altogether 275 participants attended the programme.

The resource person was Ramalakshmi Das, Senior Product Specialist, Orient Black Swan. In the first session, she spoke on 'Creating a mission and vision for the school headed by the school leader.' She said defining the vision and mission of the school would provide the educators and school leaders with a clear purpose for running the educational institution and give the direction for the school to take.

The Principals were trained on various aspects such as creating a mission statement and vision for the school as well as providing feedback to the teachers on the instructional practices and making learning more enjoyable for students.

In the second session, Ramalakshmi spoke on 'Building a cohort of focused educators to execute the plan.' She said it is important for school leaders to team up with other educators so as to realize the vision and mission of the school. The programme also discussed the role of the school leader in improving instructional practices for students and addressing the needs of students with varying learning styles to attain maximum learning benefits for each individual student. Furthermore, the programme addressed the importance of empowering teachers through up scaling their competencies through trainings that would equip them with the 21<sup>st</sup> century skills to teach students and to meet their needs while in the classroom.

In the inaugural programme, a short talk was given by the Special Guest, Dr. Neena Jha, Advisor, Education and Skills Practice, KPMG India. She said there are five stakeholders involved in the transformation process namely the student, teacher, parents, administrators and community through three scenarios which are “learn,” “help learn,” and “manage learn.” She said as school

leaders, one should do its duty with joy.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> April 2022, an orientation programme was held with the Principals of Higher Secondary Schools under Kohima district on the topic of ‘School Mentorship.’ In this, the Resource Person dwelt at length on how resources can be shared and also how the Principals can mentor other schools to perform better.

### **VARIOUS TRAINING CONDUCTED BY ATMA**

#### **TSEMINYU:**



**ATMA Tseminyu, Chunlikha Block conducted a training programme on different application methods of trichoderma on summer vegetable crops at Chunlikha village on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2022.**

ATMA Tseminyu, Chunlikha Block conducted a training programme on different application methods of trichoderma on summer vegetable crops on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2022 at Chunlikha village. The training was conducted by ATM, Kebegi Kent who taught the farmers what trichoderma is and how it can benefit them in controlling various fungal diseases and promote their crops. She also taught them the various application methods and dosage of the bio-control agent.

The use of this bio-control agent not only fights diseases but also enhances the growth of the plants. It can be used either in dry or wet formulation or slurry. It is used in seed treatment, nursery treatment, seedling root dip and foliar application. For seed treatment 5 grams of trichoderma is mixed with 1 Kg seeds, air dried for half hour and is ready to be sowed. For seedling root dip 10-20 grams of trichoderma is mixed well in 1 litre of water and the roots of the seedlings are dipped in the solution for 15 minutes, shade dried for 15 minutes and then transplanted.

#### **KOHIMA:**

ATMA Botsa Block, Kohima district conducted training and field demonstration on scientific cultivation practices on intercropping of maize and french bean at Gariphe Basa village on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022.

The resource persons ATM Neitsizo Zumvu at the training emphasized on the technical and modern scientific system of farming. Factors such as climatic conditions, soil type, management practices and cropping systems were imparted to them. ATM Hainenle



Tep shared on the cultivation practices of french bean. The various practices involved with it, like the time of sowing, seed rate and method of sowing, weed management and harvesting of the crop and advised the farmers to maintain appropriate crop spacing so as to get optimum yield per unit area, and also on the importance of proper cultivation practices.

Demonstrations on cultivation practices of kharif crops were also organized at Gariphema

village on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The resource person, Hainenle Tep shared on the climatic requirements, soil type, raising of seedlings, transplanting, spacing and irrigation. Nursery beds for brinjal and tomato were raised with the participation of the farmers.

Altogether, 25 farmers attended the activities and they were provided with maize, french bean, brinjal, tomato and chilli seeds.

Jamir. The construction of the building which is a (G+2) storied RCC structure with a total floor area of 525

sq.m/5651 sq. ft. was carried out by Contractor K. C. Angami & Sons Consortium. It commenced on 4th October 2016 and was completed on 16th October 2017, and the estimated cost of the building stands at Rs. 236.85 lakh.

Commissioner, Nagaland, Rovilatuo Mor, IAS said that no appointments can be made since there are no sanctioned posts for staff like caretakers, cooks, etc. initially, the Rest House has to be managed/maintained from an internal adjustment of funds from the Commissioner's Office. He requested the VIPs visiting the Rest House to help and support the maintenance, and appealed to all the guests to cooperate in maintaining the hygiene and infrastructure of the Rest House. Rovilatuo Mor mentioned that the rates for room rent etc. will be fixed, with a concession to be extended to the VG personnel, and the income collected from the room rent, food and lodging, etc. will not go to the government exchequer but should be accounted and utilized judiciously for the upkeep and maintenance of the Rest House.

## FOUNDATION STONE OF A 5 MEGAWATT SOLAR POWER PLANT LAID AT NIULAND

The solar power plant will be the first and biggest clean energy in the State that can produce 7-8 million units annually once completed, it can be further upgraded to 10-15 MW if successfully implemented. While addressing the gathering, the Advisor sought co-operation from the villagers to facilitate the developmental activities.

The project is expected to be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023.

Minister, Public Health Engineering, Jacob Zhimomi thanked the Advisor for the Solar Power Project at Hovukhu village and urged the villagers to be cooperative and vigilant.

MP Rajya Sabha, S Phangnon Konyak reminded the gathering that the self-reliant project is the vision of the Prime Minister of India. Advisor, Tourism and Art & Culture, Khehovi Yephthomi, Director NRE, and other officials were present at the stone laying ceremony.

## H. CHUBA CHANG LAYS FOUNDATION STONE OF DISTRICT COURT COMPLEX MON

Advisor, Justice & Law and State Council of Educational Research & Training, H. Chuba Chang on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2022 laid the foundation stone of District Court Complex and inaugurated the Judicial Officer's Quarter at Mon.

Speaking at the event, Chang stated that there should be a balance between customary laws and the judicial system for smooth functioning and proper delivery of justice in the society. He stressed on the importance of legal awareness among the Naga society.

Secretary Judicial, Department of Justice & Law, Nino Iralu, NJS stated that the

judicial system in Mon is complete, however, there is a need for infrastructural improvement. This need for improvement is being addressed with the laying of the foundation stone and the inauguration of the judicial quarter, she added.

DC Mon, Thavaseelan K, IAS praised the Judicial Officers for functioning very effectively despite the infrastructural difficulties and asserted that with the completion of the Complex, their ability to deliver justice would be facilitated in a better manner. He expressed hope that the Complex gets completed fast for Mon to have its own District Court Complex soon.

Executive Engineer, CAWD, Sungtiba Amer highlighted the technical report of the judicial quarter in which the total estimated cost i/c sites and services stands at Rs. 223.61 Lakh. It is a Ground + 1 storied RCC building with a total plinth area of 4118.40 sq. ft.



## CM RIO INAUGURATES HYDROLOGY PROJECT CONVENTION CENTRE IN DIMAPUR

The inaugural function of the Hydrology Project Convention Centre (HPCC)-cum-commissioning of Automatic Weather Station & Piezometer, constructed under National Hydrology Project (NHP) was held at E. E. Investigation Cell, 4<sup>th</sup> Mile, Dimapur on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2022.

Chief Minister, Neiphiu Rio stated that the coming of this technology will improve the management of water as well as help the farmers, industrial sector, and domestic uses. He hoped that with this technology in place, the data and information would go to the people and help adopt better practices in the utilization of water.

Advisor, Water Resources (WR), Namri Nchang mentioned that there are 12 existing projects under NHP in Dimapur, of which some are in progress, some remain completed and some are to be initiated soon. He said that taking advantage of the provision under NHP, the HPCC at Dimapur needs to conduct and facilitate all NHP related training, workshops, and events.

Chief Engineer-cum-Nodal Officer (NHP) WR, Er. Hotovi Ayemi who gave an overview of the National Hydrology Project said that the Ministry of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation is coordinating the implementation of NHP as a central scheme with World Bank assistance. The approval of the Union Cabinet for implementation

of NHP was conveyed on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2016, for a duration of 8 years. He pointed out that under this project, the department has been able to establish hydro met observation, networks, and Real Time Data Acquisition System (RTDAS). The department has successfully constructed 3 Piezometers at Kohima, Tuli (Mokokchung), and Dimapur districts to check the rise and fall in the groundwater level. However, considering the drastic climate changes globally, leading to the depletion in the surface water, there is an urgent need to explore the groundwater, he stated that the department envisages proposing additional Piezometers in the remaining districts to be accommodated under this programme.

Er. Ayemi mentioned that the department has set up a water quality lab for which furnishings have been completed while procurement of glassware and accessories is under process. The State Data Centre has been constructed at Kohima to serve as the Hub for data entry.

Executive Engineer-cum-Project Manager for HPCC (NHP), WR, Er. Keduvizo Sophie in his brief technical report, highlighted about the projects. He pointed out that HPCC has been initiated under the National Hydrology Project to build up departmental staff capacities, and impart awareness and use of the latest technologies and tools involved in water monitoring and management systems.

## UNION MINISTER ARJUN MUNDA LAYS FOUNDATION STONE OF KOHIMA VILLAGE MULTIPURPOSE BUILDING

Union Minister, Tribal Affairs Arjun Munda laid the foundation stone of the Kohima Village Multipurpose (KVM) building at Kohima Village Ground, Ziekezou on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

Munda stated that it is the vision of the Prime Minister to see that the North Eastern states come to par with the developed states of the country. He added that the Government

of India is putting in a lot of effort to see that development in all the areas are looked into so the people of the region do not feel left behind, and added that the development of tribal areas should be ensured.

The official State Right of Way (RoW) Portal was launched by Advisor, Information Technology & Communication, Science & Technology, New & Renewable Energy, Mmhonlumo Kikon on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2022 at the Directorate of Information Technology & Communication, Kohima.

Speaking at the launching programme, Kikon stated that telecom connectivity has now become an essential service with the paradigm shift to work from home, virtual meetings and video calls, online classes, etc. The uptake of e-Services, e-Commerce and e-Governance and online classes have increased significantly, he added.

The Advisor informed that the Department has undertaken a comprehensive guideline as notified by the State Government on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2019, stipulating a set of standards for granting of permission for installation of telegraph infrastructure both over ground and underground within the territorial jurisdiction of

Nagaland.

Kikon said the online portal has been developed for processing of applications and issuance of permission by the nodal officers and approving authority under the guidelines. In pursuance of the notified guidelines, the State Right of Way (RoW) online portal has been developed with the objective to ease the process for obtaining permits and bring transparency, accountability and responsiveness to all stakeholders while processing the application for Telecom Infrastructure Permissions, he added.

Kikon informed that all physical forms presently available for the identified services will be made accessible to applicants as e-Forms through the Portal. As a result, the applicant will be able to fill the form online and submit it electronically. The submitted e-Form will be routed through RoW portal to the respective nodal officer and approving authority for examining and issue of permission.
