## A BRIEF LIFE SKETCH OF DR. T. AO

### (A DIPR FEATURE)

“The fact that sports can play an important role in the education system can hardly be challenged; sports is potentially an integral part of it. Sports is considered the universal language which infuses in the people a sense of national solidarity.”

(Excerpt from the article “Sports” by Dr. T. Ao)

Talimeren Ao, popularly known as Dr. T. Ao was born to Reverend Subongwati Ningdangri and Maongsangla Changkilari on 28<sup>th</sup> January, 1918 at Changki village in the then Naga Hills of the undivided state of Assam. He was the fourth of eleven children.

Dr. T. Ao received his early education from an American Missionary School at Impur, completed his schooling from Christian High School, Jorhat and joined Cotton College, Guwahati in 1942 for his Intermediate Science. He completed MBBS from the then Carmichael Medical College (now R. G. Kar Medical College) Calcutta in 1950, becoming the first Naga to hold the degree.

From his early childhood, Dr. T. Ao displayed a strong inclination towards sports and athletic activities. He excelled not only in his studies but also in football and other sports. In 1937, he was awarded the Best Sportsperson Trophy in the Inter-High School Tournament in Jorhat and was the Individual Champion (Athletic) of Cotton College for three consecutive years. He won the Individual Championship in Athletics of Calcutta University in 1946 and 1947.

Dr. T. Ao played for Cotton College and the reputed Maharana Club of Guwahati till 1942. In 1943, he joined the renowned Mohun Bagan Club of Calcutta and played for the Club for nine years (1943-51) and captained it for two years. Established as a soccer star, Dr. T. Ao was chosen to play in the Indian team, India XI against the European teams and also led the Indian football team to the Far East to play exhibition matches in Hong Kong, Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Bangkok and Dacca. With him in the team, Bengal won the Provincial Santosh Trophy in 1945 at Bombay.

Dr. T. Ao captained the first free Indian Football team to the 1948 London Olympics. At the opening ceremony, on the 29<sup>th</sup> of July, 1948 at Wembley Stadium, London, Dr. T. Ao was the Flag Bearer for the Indian

## Contingent.

After passing MBBS in 1950, Dr. T. Ao joined Dibrugarh Medical College as Registrar (ENT). In 1953, he was transferred and posted at Kohima as Assistant Surgeon. When Nagaland attained Statehood in 1963, Dr. T. Ao became the first Naga Director of Health Services and held this post till retirement in 1978. Though in service, his zeal for sports did not diminish; he encouraged local football talents, organized the Medical Football Team and took a keen interest in local tournaments.

In 1968-69, he was selected as a member of the All India Football Selection Committee. In 1972, he received the rare honour of being made a member of the All India Council of Sports. He was also an Executive Member of the All India Council of Sports. It was largely due to his untiring efforts that the Nagaland Football Association and the Nagaland Badminton Association has been recognized and affiliated to the national bodies.

Dr. T. Ao passed away after a brief illness on 13<sup>th</sup> September, 1998, leaving behind a legacy of laudable achievements. He occupied a special place in the arena of sports and games, particularly football, not only in Nagaland but in the whole country. Dr. T. Ao is the embodiment of discipline, determination, dedication, sheer hard work and commitment which propelled him to great heights both in academics and sports beyond the reach of his Naga contemporaries. The first Naga Olympian left behind a rich legacy which continues to inspire the young and the old alike in Nagaland and the North East Region.

- I. Deciding appeal from both District and Joint CEO Committees on certification of advertisement as per the Commission Order No.509/75/2004/JS-I dated 15<sup>th</sup> April 2004.
- ii. Examining all cases of paid news on appeal against the decision of District MCMC or cases that they may take up suo motu, in which case it shall direct the concerned R O s t o issue notices to the candidates.

### STATE GOVERNMENT APPOINTS STATE NODAL OFFICER FOR SHe-BOX

Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department through a notification informed that in the interest of public service, the Government of Nagaland has appointed Sotsula, Joint Secretary, Information & Public Relations as State Nodal Officer (SNO) to oversee the functioning of the SHe-Box in relations to complaints related to sexual harassment at workplace arising in the State.

### PAYMENT OF DEARNESS RELIEF TO NAGALAND GOVERNMENT PENSIONERS/FAMILY PENSIONERS

With the introduction of the Nagaland Services (Revision of Pay) Rules, 2017, the Government of Nagaland has granted the Dearness Relief to the State Government pensioners/family pensioners for the purpose of fixation of pension under the Nagaland Services (Revision of Pay) Rules, 2017 at the following rates:

With effect from 01.06.2017: 4%

With effect from 01.07.2017: 5%

Payment of Dearness Relief involving a fraction of a rupee shall be rounded off to the next higher rupee.

The Principal Accountant General, Nagaland has been requested to circulate this O.M.

to the Accountant Generals of all states so that pensioners of the Government of Nagaland drawing pensions under their jurisdiction may be authorized for payment of this relief at the earliest.

### ADVANCE REQUISITION FOR LANDING OF STATE HELICOPTER AT ASSAM RIFLES HELIPAD

As per the circular issued by Nagaland Home Commissioner on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2018 it has come to the notice of the Government that various departments while utilizing the State Helicopter for ferrying of VIPs/VVIPs and other dignitaries visiting the State readily indicates landing at Assam Rifles Helipad without prior permission. Therefore, it is brought to the notice of all concerned that advance permission for landing of helicopter at Assam Rifles Helipad be made to HQ IGAR (North) prior to finalizing the tour programme.

Further, it has stated that the Government has a State Helipad at Lerie, Kohima as an alternative with round the clock security for landing and take off at any time. Therefore, it has been encouraged to use the State Helipad, Lerie whenever required with landing permission from the Deputy Commissioner, Kohima.

Acharya lauded the efforts undertaken by Alva's Education Foundation for nurturing and preserving the unique cultural diversity of North East by adopting students from the region. He encouraged the students to be an asset in strengthening the North East through education and treating them as one.

There are around 20 thousand students enrolled with the Alva's Education Foundation with over 600 students from North East in various hostels of the institute. 20 students from Nagaland are also pursuing their Nursing degree under the initiative of Governor, P. B. Acharya.

## GOVERNOR INAUGURATES SHILPGRAM MAHOTSAV 2018

Preserve the local culture and

languages of the North East states at all cost, urged Governor of Nagaland and Chairman, North East Zone Cultural Centre (NEZCC), P. B. Acharya. He was speaking at the inaugural programme of the Shilpgram Mahotsav 2018 at Guwahati on 17<sup>th</sup> January 2018.

Addressing the three day cultural festival, Acharya stated that we should continue to safeguard and promote our rich culture, tradition and language as they are our identity and describe who we are. Stating that unity in diversity is the peculiarity of India, he opined that emotional and national integration could further be achieved through exchange of cultural programmes between various states, and by holding such events across the country.

The three day "Shilpgram Mahotsav" was organized as part of 12<sup>th</sup> foundation day of Shilpgram at Guwahati. The main purpose of the festival is to showcase a variety of rich

cultural diversity of the region along with the artist community of the North East India along with participation from Zonal Cultural Centres across the country. Major highlights of the festival included theatre presentation, magic show, mime show, children's painting and drawing workshop, folk fusion music by various popular artistes of Assam in addition to choreographed folk dance presentation, classical dance, food and crafts mela etc. The Ministry of Culture had set up the Shilpgram in 2006 for the promotion of local art and craft.

### **CEO HOLDS MEETING WITH ALL POLITICAL PARTIES**

CEO, Nagaland, Abhijit Sinha, IAS held a meeting with all the political parties of Nagaland on 19<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at Hotel Japfu to discuss and inform about the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) and other election related matters for the conduct of the state assembly election 2018.

Abhijit Sinha asked the representatives to seek proper permission in written from the District Administration for use of public places for meeting and rally and added that as per the Election Commission of India, one candidate is allowed to incur Rs. 20 lakh for election expenditure related matters. He mentioned that many check posts are already set up where CCTV and other fixed cameras are fitted in order to track down any illegal activities. The CEO also pointed out any person carrying cash of more than Rs. 50 thousand should have proper documentation for which purpose he/she intends to spend, moreover, any person carrying Rs 10 lakh or more should be brought to the notice of the Income Tax department. As per the direction of the ECI, there will be three types of Election Observers, namely General Observer, Police Observer and Expenditure Observer and

there will be flying squad in all the districts to get hold of illegal activities. All updated documentation related to election matters and MCC for the guidance of political parties and candidates were distributed and the CEO requested the concerned political party representatives to go through it thoroughly.

### **GOVERNOR INTERACTS WITH EMPLOYMENT, SKILL DEVELOPMENT & ENTREPRENEURSHIP OFFICERS**

Governor, P. B. Acharya directed the Department of Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship to identify the skilled labour requirements in the State and train the youth accordingly so that they may be employable within the State itself. He said this during a meeting with the department officials at Raj Bhavan, Kohima on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2018.

Expressing his concern for the youth of the State, the Governor said that unemployment is one major problem faced by the State and called on the department to focus on training the youth for the development of the State and also to make employment possible. The Governor also suggested the department to co-ordinate with universities and colleges in Nagaland to introduce skill development courses in the VI Semester which will prove beneficial for jobs, self-employment and empowerment of the students.

Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship officials also briefed the Governor on the skill development activities undertaken by the department. They informed the Governor that the State has eight Industrial Training Institutes training 21 trades. The department also informed that various programmes and trainings such as Apprenticeship Training programme, Job

Mela, Job & Career Fair, etc. have been taken up to felicitate the youth.

The department officials also mentioned that 2016-17 was declared as the “Year of Construction Workers” by the Government of Nagaland and under this initiative, skills of 550 existing construction workers in the State were upgraded.

The team of officers was led by Commissioner & Secretary, Anenla T. Soto and Additional Director & HoD, Y. Vandanshan Lotha.

### **GOVERNOR MEETS REPRESENTATIVES OF UNRECOGNISED VILLAGES AND MINORITY INDIGENOUS RELIGION**

Governor, P. B. Acharya assured to look into the difficulties faced by the numerous unrecognized villages in Nagaland bordering Burma under Mon district. He said this in a meeting with representatives of Unrecognized Villages and Minority Indigenous Religion led by Dr. M. M. Thromwa Konyak at Raj Bhavan on

The Governor took note of the problems and grievances faced by the people living in the concerned area and stated that he will put the matter up with the concerned authority. Acharya also appealed to the various NGOs and charity organizations to

open up schools in the border areas so that they may also participate in the development of the State.

### **AHoD/HoDs MEETING DELIBERATES ON ECI's MCC**

The first AHoDs and HoDs meeting for the year 2018 was held on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2018 at Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima. The meeting was chaired by Chief Secretary, Pankaj Kumar, IAS. The Chief Electoral Officer, Abhijit Sinha, IAS gave a

thorough presentation of the provision of Model Code of Conduct (MCC).

The House reviewed the last minutes of AHoDs/HoDs meeting and reiterated its earlier resolutions on matters including encroachment of government lands, attendance of government employees in state and national functions, on-line billing system of power and water supply, Chief Secretary's Welfare Fund, GST and PIMS.

On land encroachment related problem, the Chief Secretary said it is the fundamental responsibility of Heads of Departments to have concern and tackle the problem in solving the issues within the vicinity of the department's allotted land. In this regard, the Chief Secretary reminded the DCs to review the matter, further stating that regular reviews should be detected at various levels and corrective measures should be taken for all concerned.

The meeting reiterated and discussed further about attendance of the government employees in the State's function to which, the Chief Secretary pointed out that HoDs should take serious note of regular attendance of all the employees. He said that attendance of the employees and their

participation is as important as any other normal duties and assignments. It was also discussed that online billing system in Power Department has been increasing and improving with its implementation in eight districts. Following suit, PHE water supply e-billing system might also be soon implemented. Pankaj Kumar reiterated and requested the departments to contribute to the Chief Secretary Welfare Fund.

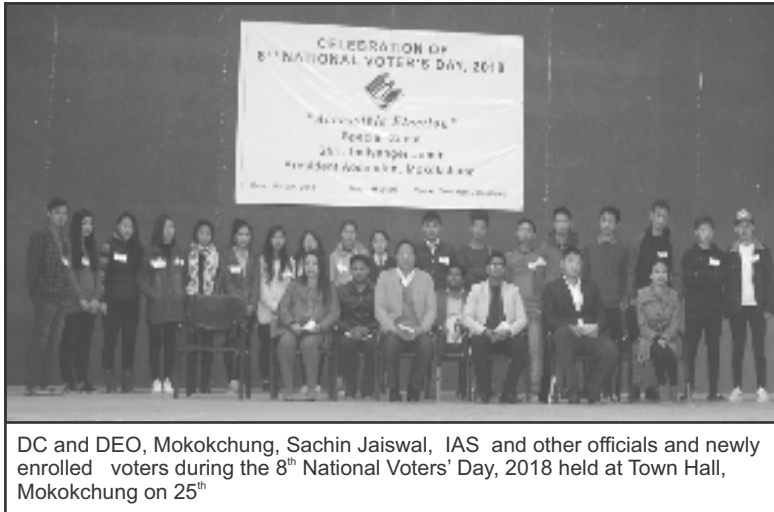

He said Nagaland today stands at the cusp of history and the intense desire of the people of Nagaland has been for a final settlement of the Naga political issue. Over the years, the State Government, the NNPGs, the churches, civil societies and the NGOs have been trying their best to facilitate the resolution of the Naga political issue. He also expressed his happiness that Nagaland Churches, NGOs and Civil Societies have come out with campaigns for 'Clean Election' in all seriousness.

Nagaland is a young State with almost 60 percent of the population below the age of 25, as such the youth of Nagaland are the pride of the country. Governor Acharya said people were inspired by the legendary Dr. T. ### **CEO BRIEFS MEDIA ON ELECTION NOTIFICATION**

Chief Electoral Officer, Nagaland, Abhijit Sinha, IAS briefed the media persons on the upcoming General Elections in the State at CEO's Office, Kohima on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2018.

Abhijit mentioned that 2194 polling stations are there in the State and two Auxillary Polling Stations have come up because of the presence of more than 1400 voters. Training for polling personnel have already commenced, all polling personnel are given atleast three rounds of training. Display of VVPAT machines in all the villages have been carried out since it will be used in all the places from this general elections onwards, he said. Postal Ballots for Service Voters called ETPBS system will be

used where postal ballot paper will be sent to them through emails and it will return through post.

He further informed that there are 55 ROs for the 60 Assembly Constituencies. AROs can do all the duties of ROs except Scrutiny which can be carried out only in special unavoidable circumstances by the AROs. Form 1 will be issued for filing of nomination.

Sinha said there are 555 polling stations where live webcasting will be carried out, and in those polling stations where internet connectivity is poor, fixed cameras will be installed in order to check electoral malpractices. 55 Election Observers will be in the State for the elections.

### **DR. SHURHOZELIE LIEZIETSU INAUGURATES HALL OF AMK BUILDING-CUM-GENERAL CONFERENCE**

Products have to be good, he said, adding that prices of the commodities should at the same time be affordable. He impressed the gathering of the importance of post-harvest management and packaging.

The State is doing relatively well in horticulture sector and farmers have been earning a lot besides the many success stories

through the implementation of Technology Mission programmes under the Ministry of Agriculture, said Director, Horticulture, Dr. R. Elithung Lotha, delivering the keynote address. Nagaland has the potential of exporting organic produces, he said, pointing that many buyers have expressed and shown interest in the same.

Elithung said that Dimapur having a population of over 3-4 lakhs, the demand for vegetables and fruits is high. He pointed on the importance of having such a unit to produce quality planting materials to meet the demands. He also apprised of the Department's plan to send officers and young educated youths with interest in horticulture sector for skill development training to run the unit on a Public Private Partnership mode.

The Hi-Tech Vegetable Seedlings Production Unit at State Horticulture Nursery, Dimapur was constructed at a cost of two crores by Saveer Company. Secretary, Horticulture, Alan Gonmei, IAS chaired the inaugural programme and Deputy Director, Horticulture, Jerry Patton pronounced the vote of thanks.

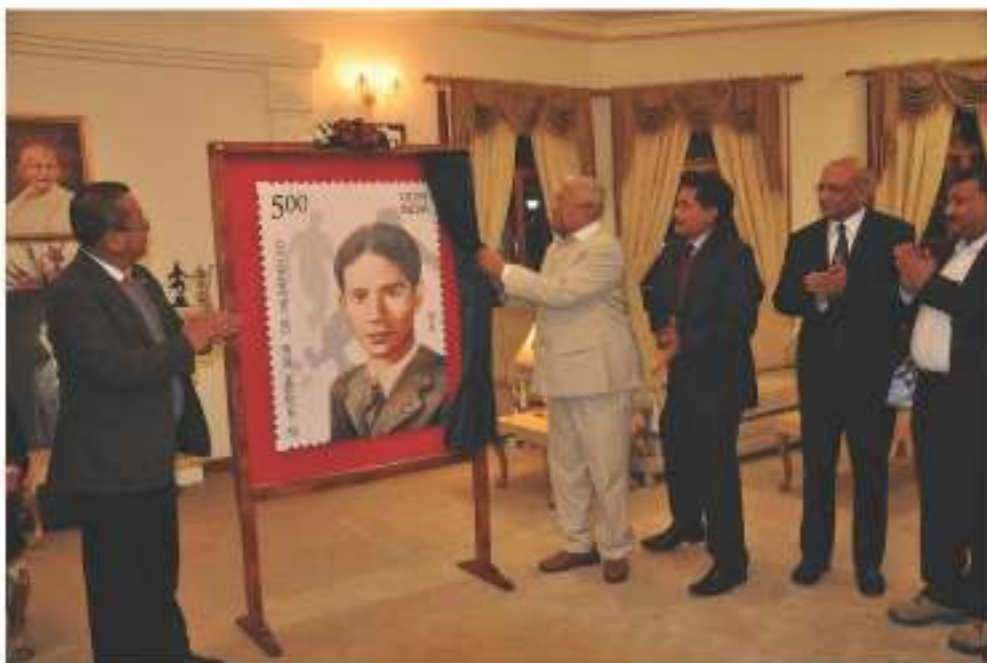
