IODINE DEFICIENCY DISORDER (AKUMMEREN, INFORMATION ASSISTANT, DIPR)

Iodine Deficiency Disorder is a public health problem all over the world. It is confirmed that one out of every five people in India lives in IDE endemic areas. These disorders are caused by lack of iodine in the diet, which ranges from simple goitre, mental retardation, stunted growth of cretinism. Most of these disorders are permanent yet all of them are preventable only by consuming good quality iodised salt daily.

Answers to some common questions on iodine deficiency disorders:

1. WHAT IS IODINE?

Iodine is a micro-nutrient essential to human life. Some of the most vital functions of the human body depend on a regular supply of iodine.

2. WHAT IS THE SOURCE OF IODINE?

Iodine is naturally available in the soil and water. Our normal requirement comes from crops grown on iodine-rich soil. Therefore, when the soil of any area lacks iodine, the crops grown on such areas lack iodine. Consequently, those people who live on iodine deficient land do not get the daily requirement of iodine from the diet,

3. WHY IS IODINE SO IMPORTANT?

Because it is essential for normal growth, development and functioning of both the brain and the body. More importantly, without enough iodine, a newborn's brain and body can become permanently retarded and stunted. A pregnant woman who is deficient in iodine is likely to produce an abnormal child.

4. HOW MUCH IODINE DOES A PERSON NORMALLY NEED?

The average daily requirement of an adult is 150 micrograms. However small the quantity may be, it is yet important that the body gets this quantity daily.

5. WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A PERSON DOES NOT GET ENOUGH IODINE?

Iodine deficiency in the diet forms a group of abnormalities known as Iodine Deficiency Disorders. It includes goitre, mental retardation, speech and hearing defects, squint, difficulties in standing & walking normally and growth retardation. During pregnancy, it causes abortion, stillbirth or birth of mentally deficient baby.

6. WHY DOES A CHILD BECOME A CRETIN?

A baby in the mother's womb requires regular supply of iodine for the normal growth and development of its brain and body. But when the mother is iodine deficient, the child too is deprived of this much needed nutrient. If the deficiency is severe, the growth and development of the child's brain and body are permanently stunted and it becomes a cretin, causing inability to walk, talk or think normally.

7. WHERE DOES IODINE DEFICIENCY DISORDER OCCUR IN INDIA?

It occurs in almost all the States and Union Territories of our country. The most affected areas lie in the Sub-Himalayan belt extending from Jammu & Kashmir to the North-East including Nagaland covering an area of 2500 sqKms.

8. WHAT IS IODISED SALT?

Iodised salt is nothing but the common salt to which a small quantity of iodine compound is added. It is used to prevent iodine deficiency. It looks, tastes and smell exactly like ordinary salt.

9. WHY IS IODINE ADDED TO SALT

Iodine is added to salt for the simple reason that we all use salt everyday irrespective of caste, religion or economic status in normal quantities of about 10 to 15 grams a day. If this amount is iodised we automatically get the right amount of iodine that is required everyday.

10. CAN CONSUMPTION OF IODISED SALT CURE GOITRE, CRETINISM AND OTHER IODINE DEFICIENCY DISORDERS?

No, most of the iodine deficiency disorders are permanent and incurable. However, these disorders can be easily prevented by consuming iodised salt regularly.

11. WILL CONSUMPTION OF EXCESS F HARM ME?

No our body will utilize only the required quantity of iodine and the excess (if any) will be excreted unused through the urine.

12. CAN PREGNANT WOMEN AND CHILDREN USE IODISED SALT?

Yes, pregnant women and young children requires iodine even more than others.

13. HOW CAN I KNOW IF SALT CONTAINS IODINE?

We can know the content of iodine by testing the salt with a simple salt testing-kit method.

14. DO ANIMALS NEED IODISED SALT?

Yes, iodised salt improves the health and productivity of animals and reduces the number of stillbirth and miscarriages. Also cattle that are fed with iodised salt produce milk rich in iodine

15. HOW SHOULD IODISED SALT BE STORED?

Iodised salt should be stored in an air tight container because prolonged exposure to direct sunlight and moisture can destroy the iodine in the salt.

16. IS THE SALE OF NON-IODISED SALT BANNED IN OUR STATE?

Yes. The sale of non-iodised salt is banned under the provision of PFA Act 1954 which is still enforced in our state. Any trader found selling non-iodised salt for human consumption is liable for prosecution under provision of the said Act.

17. WHAT SHOULD THE TRADERS DO?

- i) Shopkeepers should stock and sell only iodised salt.
- ii) They should ensure proper storage of iodised salt away from direct sunlight and rain.
- iii) They should label the salt meant for farm or animal use as "NOT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION"

18. WHAT CAN YOU DO TO PREVENT IODINE DEFICIENCY DISORDERS?

YOU CAN:

- i) Disseminate the information on Iodine Deficiency Disorders, its consequences, control & preventive measures.
- ii) Purchase & consume iodised salt only.
- iii) Store iodised salt in closed containers.
- iv) Keep the iodised salt in a proper place and not near or above the fireplace.
- v) Check & store iodised salt for not more than six months.

AN APPEAL

It is all about a very minute nutrient called “Iodine” which is essential for manufacturing two vital hormones in our body namely thyroxin and tri-iodothyronin that are responsible for maintaining normal growth and development of both brain and body.

Our body requires a daily supply of 150 micrograms of iodine which is to be obtained from the food we consumed. But the fact that we live in the sub-Himalayan region, which is declared as iodine deficient zone and also the hilly topography, heavy rainfall, frequent flooding, traditional practice of jhum cultivation and burning of forest etc, have all contributed to loss of iodine from the soil mass, rendering the food crops grown on our soil with less iodine or no iodine content. The consequence of iodine deficiency in the diet are exceedingly grievous which includes mental retardation, stunted growth, lowering of IQ level, poor school performance, speech and hearing defect, difficulty in standing and walking, abortion, birth of dead babies and goiter (swelling in the neck).

The only effective control and preventive measure to combat this menace consists of sustained supply, proper storage and consumption of good quality iodised salt.

Therefore it is appealed to all concerned:

- i) To store iodised salt in well ventilated room (Attn, stockiest).
- ii) To keep iodised salt in frames at least 1 ft. above the floor with sufficient space between the rows and away from the wall (stockiest).
- iii) To label non-iodised salt as ‘NOT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION’ (Attn. Traders).
- iv) To keep iodised salt in the kitchen shelf in closed container.
- v) Not to keep iodised salt near or above the fire place.
- vi) Not to store iodised salt for a long time.
- vii) Not to purchase iodised salt in bulks.
- viii) To report to the Local Health Authority if non-iodised salt was found sold by the traders for human consumption for it is banned under PFA Act, and
- ix) While cooking to put iodised salt towards the end of cooking.

You may not be a victim of Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD) but remember you are responsible to carry the information to all 1.5 Billion people in the World and over 200 million people in our country who are at risk of getting IDD's.

“Iodine is important for your children's mental health”.

State Round Up

STATE OBSERVES INTERNATIONAL DAY OF OLDER PERSONS

KOHIMA:

Life is meant to be celebrated in every stage, and the least we owe to the senior citizens is to give them the joy of living a comfortable contented life for all the years they have contributed to the society, stated Secretary Social Welfare, Dellirose M. Sakhrie while addressing the International Day of Older Persons at Zonal Council Hall, Kohima on 1st October 2016.

She said that the United Nations' International Day of Older Persons is celebrated every on 1st October to examine issues that affect their lives and more importantly, to appreciate their contributions towards the society. Stressing on the theme "Take a Stand Against Ageism", Dellirose explained that 'ageism' is a discrimination faced by a group of bracketed category of people who are in the age of 60 years and above.

The Secretary also informed the gathering that the State Government under the Social Welfare Department has already drafted the State Rules for the Maintenance & Welfare of Parents & Senior Citizens and is under the consideration of the Government. She also said that the State Old Age Pension which started in 1981 was merged with the Central scheme Indira Gandhi Old Age Pension and on State/Central share basis the department is presently providing Old Age

Pension to 51,750 senior citizens between the age of 60-79 and Old Age Pension to 3161 senior citizens above 80 years. There are five numbers of NGOs running Old Age Homes in Kohima, Mokokchung, Zunheboto, Phek and Dimapur district who receive State grant in aid from time to time while separate OPDs for senior citizens are also provided in Community Health Centers in most of the districts, she added.

Exhorting the gathering, N. Theyo said we cannot demand respect from the society unless we respect ourselves and make ourselves respectable and to be positive and look forward to live for another 30 to 50 years. He called on the gathering to not hover over history of what they did during their but should act as a sweet memory.

State Award for Senior Citizens were awarded to Rev Dr. L. Noksangchila, 89 years of age and Dr. C Thridongse, 86 years of age for their contribution to the society. District Awards were presented to Vichu-u Zashumo and Chatuo Paphino. All senior citizens present at the programme were also felicitated by the Department. On an invitation by the Governor of Nagaland, P.B Acharya a delegation from Central Institute of Indian Languages visited Kohima.

Bharatavani Project, under Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), Mysuru (under Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India) has chalked out an action plan for the development of languages of Nagaland including development of dictionaries, learning materials etc. It was decided that an online learning programme for Tenyidie (Angami) dialect may be commissioned within a year, in collaboration with the University of Nagaland, Kohima Campus.

During his meeting with the CIIL officials and the representatives of various knowledge institutions in Nagaland, the Governor, P B Acharya advised that the languages and cultural identities of the Naga people have to be promoted saying that the language of a person is his first identity.

The institute is concerned with protection and promotion of Indian Languages and development of such languages as a means of promoting better understanding among different communities and to strengthen emotional and national integration.

The CIIL delegation comprised of Prof. D.G. Rao, Director, V.V. Bhat, Senior Consultant, Dr R Ramamoorthy, Reader and Research Officer, Beluru Sudarshana, Consultant for Bharatavani Project, Dr. Chandan Singh and Dr Hidam Dolen Singh,

KAZIRANGA SUMMIT: NAGALAND-ASSAM TO FOSTER CORDIAL RELATIONS

In what could probably be the first time ever in the history of the region when the Chief Ministers of Assam and Nagaland got to meet each other on their own accord rather than being invited by Central leaders often after some provocative incidents, Assam Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal and Nagaland Chief Minister T.R. Zeliang met at Kaziranga on October 17, 2016 and

discussed how to create a more cordial relation between the two neighbouring States.

In an atmosphere of bonhomie, made more so since the two Chief Ministers are good friends having studied in the same school in their childhood days (Don Bosco School, Dibrugarh) and also both having been taught by late PA Sangma in the school, it was more or less a get-together of very good neighbours who have finally found time to visit and pay respects to each other.

No problem or issue is too big to be solved when parties concerned get to meet each other across the table and discuss with an open mind, and with determination to solve the matter, said Nagaland Chief Minister and added that it had been his declared stand that border issues which have cropped up between the two neighbouring States from time to time should be solved amicably by the people instead of depending on the Court to pass a judgement.

The concept of meeting each other is the first step to maintain, nurture and promote cordial and lasting relation, Zeliang said and recalled how Nagaland was once a part of Assam.

To achieve this relationship, we have to create a human relation in the true spirit of good neighbours, he opined.

He suggested that the border districts of Assam should be encouraged to use the facilities of Nagaland such as Airport and Railway head at Dimapur as "their own".

Zeliang went on to suggest protection and preservation of Reserved forests with border areas of the two states, like Intangki in Nagaland and Dhansiri forest in Assam etc, and also promised to extend full cooperation to check the menace of poaching of the

famed one-horned Rhino which is found exclusively in Assam, saying "Rhino poaching is a national problem." On the strategic location of the two States vis-à-vis Act East Policy of the Government of India, Zeliang suggested road connectivity with South | East Asia from Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia) to Manipur- Nagaland-Assam, saying the Policy can be successful only if the Northeastern States are made active participants in the trade and commerce activities.

In his response, Sarbananda Sonowal, Chief Minister, Assam said "today is a historic day for the two States and we must work together for mutual growth and move forward along with the rest of the country". He added that differences and issues should be mutually addressed in a spirit of goodwill. Today's meeting of the two Chief Ministers will send a positive message to the younger generations of both the states, and that people are eagerly awaiting the outcome to the meeting. Sonowal also responded positively to Zeliang's invitation to attend this year's Hornbill Festival, saying that several cultural troupes from Assam should participate in this year's Hornbill Festival at Kisama.

He suggested setting up of a Committee for border areas consisting of the local MLAs/ MPs and Government officials so that petty issues are tackled mutually at the local level, and also to foster better relations between the peoples.

Addressing the students, Director, Health & Family Welfare, Dr. John Swayievisa said that IDD is a global issue and 21st October has been marked to generate awareness and to continue working to prevent iodine deficiency disorder. He explained that iodine deficiency leads to abnormalities known as Iodine Deficiency Disorder (IDD) which includes goitre, mental retardation, growth retardation etc. Also during pregnancy it causes abortion, stillbirth or birth of mentally deficient baby.

Programme Officer, NIDDCP, Dr. Akuo Sorhie said that iodine is very important for the human body and that some of our vital organs need a daily dose of iodine for it to function normally. She was stated that 1/3 of the world population suffer from IDD and IDD was the main reason for mental disorder in the world. Dr. Sorhie explained that the simplest way to avoid IDD is to consume good quality iodised salt. She explained the various disorder caused by lack of iodine and how it effects a person. The only solution to prevent IDD is to maintain the required level of iodine in our body, she explained.

Principal, Northfield School, Jaison Jose said that the purpose of having such

Speaking on the topic of 'HIV Scenario and Services available in Nagaland', Deputy Director (M&E), NSACS, Dr. Vezokholu Theyo said that the Cumulative record since 1999 to Sept 2016 shows that a total number of

899158 persons have been tested for HIV out of which 20601 persons were tested positive. 91% of transmission of HIV was through the sexual route while 6% was from parent to child, she said. Dr. Vezokholu stated that the State of Nagaland stands first in the country when it comes to the General Prevalence rate and third in the Adult Prevalence rate at 0.78%. She also explained that according to data collected (April-Sept 2016) by NSACS, the age group 25-34 years stands highest in the State at 43% as per the Age wise sero positive of general clients.

Deputy Director (IEC), NSACS, Thejangunuo said that media plays a very important role in the society and needs to be informed when it comes to reporting on HIV and AIDS. She said HIV& AIDS is a story of critical importance, and all readers/ audiences/viewers deserve full, clear and intelligent coverage and advised that media to equip themselves with the right kind of knowledge about HIV&AIDS. She said that the Press Council of India under the mandate of section 13(2)b of the Press Council Act

of 1978, came up with a set of guidelines to facilitate the functioning of the media and guidelines on coverage of HIV/AIDS related matter was drawn up in 1993 and asked the media to keep a copy of the of guidelines. She advised the media to make photographs, illustrations & cartoons positive and to debunk myths related to prevention of HIV and miracle cures.

She also informed that the national AIDS toll free helpline number: 1097 can be reached at from any land line number or any mobile number for information related HIV and AIDS.

A presentation on Basics of HIV & AIDS was made by Asst. Director, NSACS, Alipoker while Deputy Director, NSACS, Tarepnokcha Jamir was the moderator of the programme. DIPR officials and media personel attended the sensitization programme.

The UnnatJyoti by Affordable LEDs for All (UJALA) scheme, energy efficient fans and tube lights programmes are being implemented by Energy Efficient Service Limited (EESL), a JV under the administration of Ministry of Power, Government of India. In Nagaland, EESL plans to distribute over 25 lakh LED bulbs, 1.5 lakh energy efficient fans and 2.5 lakh tube lights to people on upfront payment.

The Chief Guest, Dr. Nicky switching on the LED bulbs and fans in the Conference Hall of Deputy Commissioner Kohima expressed confident that by switching on the LED bulb and fan, it would save the energy in near future. He congratulated the district administration and the EESL Company for having initiated such a programme and expressed confidence that better outcome would prevail in future. Taking the chance, he also appealed all the officers from different districts to initiate the programme and move forward in their respective districts to see that the whole State is covered with this programme.

Deputy Commissioner Kohima, Rovilatuo Mor, IAS in his keynote address

said that the District Administration has taken up the initiative to tackle with the problem of wide gap between high demand and short supply of power, a general phenomena throughout the State resulting to undesirable but unavoidable load-shedding, the worst being at Christmas festive seasons. He said that the grim scenario of power status in Kohima district is that the installed capacity is 24 MVA with 132/33KV (maximum), the demand for power is 26 MV with an increase of 2MV/every year, and with the festive season approaching it is expected to cross 30MV, which will only invite more frequent load-shedding. He said that the district has taken up the initiative in direct liase with the EESL for procurement/distribution and installation of highly subsidized LED bulbs/tubes/fans throughout the district.

A brief report on the District Initiative towards “Energy Efficient Kohima” was given by Assistant Commissioner, Reny Wilfred, IAS (P) while technical demonstration and short speech was also given by EESL representative and vote of thanks was proposed by SDO (C) Sadar Kohima, KethosituoSekhose. The launching programme chaired by ADC Kohima, LithronglaTongpi was attended by Chief Engineer Power, SP Kohima and other Government officials’ including DPDB members, representatives from Districts Administrative, KVC, Wards, Colonies and LED applicants. During the launching ceremony a total number of 50,000 LED Bulbs were distributed to all the representatives of wards, colonies and villages under Kohima Town and also to some other surrounding villages under Kohima district.

WORKSHOP ON “PROPER

GUIDANCE FOR PROMOTING TOBACCO FREE INSTITUTIONS & HAZARDS OF TOBACCO” AT KOHIMA

He emphasized on the main provisions of the Act which included Section-4 “Prohibition of smoking in specified public places”; Section-5 “Prohibition of advertisement, promotion and sponsorship of all tobacco products”; Section-6 (a) “Prohibition on sale of tobacco products to minor” (b) “Prohibition on sale of tobacco products near educational institutions; and Section-7 “Depiction of specified health warnings on tobacco packages”

District Nodal Officer, DTCC Kohima, Dr. Arenla Walling presented the guidelines for teachers to promote tobacco free schools and colleges in the district. She highlighted on various steps for disseminating information on hazards of tobacco products, guidelines for group discussion, facilitator, how to say “No” to tobacco, suggested activity for the students and teachers to explain the facts to

the students. Twenty number of “Smoke Free Ambassador Card” were distributed to each 16 declared Tobacco Free Schools, Colleges and Institutions during the programme.

APPEAL FOR PROTECTION OF WILDLIFE IN THE STATE OF NAGALAND

The survival of human beings and animals, both directly as well as indirectly, depends on forests; as their basic needs in the form of food, water, and shelter are met from forests. In addition to these tangible benefits, forests play key role in carbon sequestration, amelioration of environment and climate change.

With passage of time and increasing population, biotic pressure on forests has significantly increased. In the State of Nagaland, the lion's share (88.3%) of forests are under the control of individuals and communities and remaining 11.7% of the forests are under the control of the Government. The Government has very limited regulatory role in management of private forests. Since time immemorial, administration and people of the State had/have played an important role in protection and maintenance of forests in the form of Community Conservation Areas, Wildlife Based Community Conservation Areas etc.

The existence of wildlife is a good indicator of good forests and subsequently availability of timber, firewood, medicinal plants for human beings. The State of Nagaland had been traditionally a hunting State since time immemorial. Now, people are coming forward for protection of wildlife and they are rescuing wild animals and they are donating wild animals and birds which are kept in Nagaland Zoological Park, Rangapahar and Tragopan Breeding Centre, Kohima.

With the efforts of the administration, people and different agencies of the Government, NGOs etc, Amur Falcons (Migratory Birds) were well protected in the State during their migration in 2013, 2014 and 2015. This brought laurels, both nationally and internationally, to the State. The people of the State were awarded at different forums for the conservation works.

Amur Falcons are expected to arrive in the State around mid September 2016 during their migration from Siberia and Mangolia, Northern China and Japan. The migratory birds are expected to stay in the State till November 2016.

On behalf of the Forest Department, Chief Wildlife Warden, Nagaland, Satya Prakash Tripathi has appealed to the public, Government officials, Village Councils, army and Para military personnel, students, NGOs and other stakeholders for protection of Wildlife in general and Amur Falcon (the State's Guest) in particular.
