# OFFICIAL ORDERS *and* NOTIFICATIONS

## P&AR INFORMS ON ENHANCEMENT OF UPPER AGE LIMIT FOR ENTRY INTO GOVERNMENT SERVICE

In supersession of all Government Notifications/Office Memoranda regarding prescribed age limits, the Personnel & Administrative Reforms (P&AR) Department has issued the following lower and upper age limits to enter into Government Service as under:

### 1. Age limits by Grade:

- a) Group D : Minimum 18 years and maximum 32 years
- b) Group A, B and C : Minimum 21 years and maximum 32 years

### 2. Age Relaxations:

- a) Scheduled Tribe (ST) : 5 years relaxation (upper age limit of 37 years).
- b) Government employees : Relaxation equal to years of service served subject to a maximum of 5 years.

This shall come into effect from 9<sup>th</sup> October 2024. This is issued with the approval of the Cabinet vide NO.CAB-1/14/2023 dated 9/10/2024.

For chartering, at least 48 Mrs. requisition in advance to be submitted to General Manager's Office, NST Dimapur and additional 10 Minutes Flying Time shall be added for flying from Hangar to Apron and vice-versa for chartering cases. 2. The passenger carrying capacity for every sector will depend upon the load/weight of the passengers and maximum baggage of 5 Kg per passenger.
3. Operation of the State Helicopter Service is subject to weather and technical conditions.
4. Operation of Service on every sector shall be subject to availability of at least 80% load factor on both ways and availability of safe landing helipad.

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT INFORMS ON CMLIS CLAIMS PROCESSING

---

The State Finance Department has issued the following important guidelines regarding the Claims Processing under the Chief Minister's Universal Life Insurance Scheme (CMLIS), for the benefit of beneficiaries and their families. The CMLIS initiative is designed to provide comprehensive support to families affected by death of breadwinner or affected by accidents, ensuring financial security through a clear and efficient claims processing.

### 1. **Claims for death of breadwinner due to any reason:**

- A. The person should be registered as breadwinner in CMLIS portal.
- B. Claim/Death must be intimated to the Insurance Facilitation Cell of Finance Department, within three weeks through call or WhatsApp to 9366494507.
- C. The facilitation cell will assist in further documentation. Detailed instructions are available on the official website - [cmlis.gov.in](http://cmlis.gov.in).

### 2. **Accidental Insurance Claim:**

- A. What is considered as 'Accident' under this policy? 'Accident' means a sudden, unforeseen and involuntary event caused by external, violent and visible means. Natural calamities being in the nature of accidents, any death/disability resulting from such natural calamities is also covered under CMLIS. While death due to suicide is not covered, that from murder is covered. In case of incidents like road, rail and similar vehicular accidents, drowning, death involving any crime etc. the accident should be reported to police. In case of incidents like snake bite, fall from tree etc. the cause should be supported by immediate hospital record.

#### **B. What is not covered/regarded as 'Accident' under this policy?**

- Illness/Loss caused by childbirth/pregnancy.
- Illness/Loss caused due to mosquito bite and resultant diseases.
- Illness/Loss caused due to bio-chemical nuclear weapons.
- Illness/ Loss caused by participating in civil riot/rebellion/terrorism activities.
- Intentional self-inflicted injury or illness.
- Injury under the influence of intoxicants or hallucinogens.
- Suicide/attempt of suicide.
- Willful participation in illegal activities.
- Pre-existing diseases and complications arising from it.
- Participation in sports and adventure sports without the supervision of a trained professional.

### **3. Claim process for accidental disability or death of breadwinner or dependant:**

- The claimants must be registered as a beneficiary under CMLIS and will cover deaths due to accident as confirmed by documentary evidence only.
- **Time intimation of claim:** Claims must be reported within seven days of the accident and no later than one month from the date of the actual or potential loss. The intimation shall be provided over call or WhatsApp to 9366494507.
- **Mandatory intimation to nearest police station:** It is mandatory to report the accident to the nearest police station and ensure it is documented in the General Diary.
- **Mandatory post mortem for death claims:** A post-mortem report is mandatory for claims related to death.
- **Inquest reports wherever postmortem is not possible:** If a post-mortem is not feasible due to a genuine reason, an inquest report from the Administrative Officer or Executive Magistrate under Section 194 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNNS) must be submitted. This report should include photos of injuries sustained due to accident if any, photos taken during the inquest with police personnel present and a medical certificate indicating the cause of death.
- **Immediate necessary action by affected family:**

Families affected by an accident should promptly approach the administration to conduct an inquest when a post-mortem is not possible.

- **Claim documentation:** Comprehensive details regarding the claims process can be found at [cmlis.gov.in](http://cmlis.gov.in).
- In case of death of breadwinner due to accident, both life insurance and accidental insurance claims can be processed independently.

**Important note for claimants:** The CMLIS Portal is still open for the general public who have not registered for the scheme and may register themselves. All claimants are to strictly adhere to these guidelines to ensure the timely processing of claims without rejection by the Insurance Provider. ## GUIDELINES FOR ISSUING DUPLICATE APPOINTMENT ORDER/OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS

---

The Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms (P&AR) has observed that some Government employees apply for duplicate appointment orders/official documents pertaining to service matters due to the loss of original appointment order/official document, and in the absence of proper guidelines, inconsistencies have arisen in the issuance of these duplicates across different establishments.

Hence, to ensure uniformity and prevent discrepancies, the following guidelines are hereby established for obtaining a duplicate appointment order/official document pertaining to service matters:

1. Upon losing the original appointment order/official document, the employee must file a First Information Report (FIR) at the nearest police station within 30 days of the loss.
2. The employee shall publish a 'Lost Document' notice in local newspapers.
3. Authenticity of the employee's details will be verified by the authorized issuing authority - HoD for non-gazetted employees and AHoD for gazetted employees, by checking against the service record available in the Department such as pay roll, acquaintance roll and Service Book entry, ensuring that all appointment/service event entries have been made in the Service Book under the attestation of the competent attester's authority, and that there is a certified copy of initial pay and drawal from the pay acquaintance roll.
4. Prior approval must be obtained from the Personnel and Administrative Reforms (P&AR) Department before issuing the duplicate appointment order/official document.
5. The duplicate appointment order/official document must contain the same terms and conditions as the original. No alterations or modifications are permitted under any circumstances.
6. The Department shall ensure that the originality of the appointment order/official document is retained by diligently making timely entries in the Service Book and strictly maintaining the Guard File and other modes of record keeping.

All Government establishments are directed to strictly adhere to these guidelines when processing requests for duplicate appointment orders/official documents pertaining to service matters.

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT NOTIFIES

Finance Department has notified that in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 125(1) of the Nagaland Municipal Act 2023, the Governor of Nagaland is pleased to constitute the Fourth Nagaland State Finance Commission with a Chairman and two other Members as follows:

1. Sarah R. Ritse, Commissioner & Secretary : Chairperson to the Government of Nagaland (Retd.)
2. G.W. Lee, Director, Treasuries & Accounts (Retd.) : Member
3. Khrupi Sothu, Secretary (Retd.) : Member Secretary

1. The tenure of the Commission shall be for a period of 12 months from the date of issue of this notification.
2. The Commission shall make recommendations relating to the following matters:
  - A. The principles which shall govern:
    - i. The distribution between the State and the Municipalities of the net proceeds of taxes, duties, tolls and fees leviable by the State, which may be divided between them.
    - ii. The determination of taxes, duties, tolls, fees which may be assigned to, or appropriated by the Municipalities; and
    - iii. The grant-in-aid to the Municipalities from the Consolidated Fund of the State.
  - B. The measures needed to improve the financial position of the Municipalities.
  - C. The rates of various taxes, tolls and fees that may be raised by the Municipalities and the method of determining the same.
  - D. Any other matter referred to the Commission by the Government in the interest of sound finances of the Municipalities.
3. In making its recommendations, the Commission shall have regard among other considerations to:
  - A. The objective of balancing the receipts and the expenditure of the State Government and the local bodies and for generating surplus for capital investment.
  - B. The resource of the State Government and demands, thereon particularly in respect of expenditure on civil administration, maintenance and upkeep of capital assets, maintenance of expenditure on plan schemes and other committed expenditure or liabilities of the State; and
  - C. The requirement of the Municipalities, their potential for raising resources and for reducing expenditure.
  - D. Terms of the Office of the Chairman and the whole Team Members and conditions of their services and other allowances shall be as prescribed under Rule 6 and 7 of the Nagaland Finance Commission Rules, 2008.
  - E. The Commission shall make its report available by 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025 covering the period of five years (2026-2031) commencing from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2026.

## SMS & WEB BASED IT PROJECT LAUNCHED

Office of the Principal Accountant General (A&E) Nagaland, Kohima has informed all State Government employees that in pursuance to the initiative of the Office of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India, the SMS & Web based IT Project has been launched for the benefit of State Government employees. This IT Project is SMS based and encapsulates entitlement functions like Pension, GPF and GE. The SMS & Web based IT project aims to bring transparency at every stage of Pension, GPF and Payslip/Leave/Leave encashment finalization by providing SMS to their registered mobile number

**For Pension:** The retiring officials will be intimated during receipt, clarification required if any, and finalization of pension case. The SMS will provide website link and temporary User ID & Password (which has to be changed after logging in) to download the digitally signed personal copy of pension authorities (PPO intimation slip, GPO, CPO). To avail this facility, pensioners are requested to furnish mobile numbers along with their pension documents.

**For GPF:** The GPF subscribers will be intimated for receipt and finalization of their respective GPF final payment case. The SMS will provide website link and temporary User ID & Password (which has to be changed after logging in) to download the digitally signed personal copy of the GPF final payment authority.

**For GE:** All gazetted officers will be intimated via SMS which will provide website link and temporary User ID & Password (which has to be changed after logging in) to download their respective Pay slip/LAR/LARR/LER once the same is authorized and uploaded on the website. To avail this facility, gazetted officers are requested to furnish mobile numbers mentioning name, designation and department.

On receipt of User ID & Password, the user may follow the following steps to download their respective Pension/GPF/GE authority:

- Go to the link <https://smswebservicesagaenagaland.cag.aov.in>
- Enter User ID and password received through SMS
- Enter Captcha and click 'Log in.'
- After logging in, click 'Download' to download the respective Pension/GPF/GE authorities.
- User may also select 'Reset Password' to reset their respective password after logging in.

On the occasion of International Coffee Day, the Directorate of Land Resources organized an event on the theme 'Collaboration for a better tomorrow' at the office conference hall, Kohima on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2024.

Advisor, Land Resources, G. Ikuto Zhimomi delivering his message, emphasized on promoting Nagaland coffee across the districts by creating cafes and coffee bars offering world-class coffee at reasonable prices. He also encouraged the youth to take up coffee entrepreneurship seriously keeping in view the scope of employment and economic desire of the people. Zhimomi also encouraged the Land Resources Department and Coffee Board of India to continue promoting coffee development in the State, support the coffee farmers, and work towards taking Nagaland grown coffee to greater heights. He remarked that the Department has been actively supporting coffee development at all levels such as area expansion, post-harvest processing, roasting

of coffee beans and also providing barista training to the youth interested in the art of coffee making.

Highlighting the development of coffee production in Nagaland context, the Advisor said that it was taken up during 1970s and 1990s, however, not much progress was achieved at that point of time. He added that in 2014, the Coffee Board partnered with the Department of Land Resources took up visionary initiatives to revive the coffee plantations in the State, adding that before 2014, coffee plantations in Nagaland were around 145 hectares area, whereas now, area under coffee plantation has increased to 10,200 hectares.

Commissioner & Secretary, Land Resources, Kevekha Kevin Zehol delivering the keynote address, said Nagaland is fortunate because coffee crop can grow all over the state; coffee thrives well at 800 meters to 1,500 meter and Nagaland has the perfect soil condition for that. He also emphasised on the importance of advertising

and social media, and urged the Department to advocate and propagate home-grown coffee through the Information & Public Relations Department publications and other government publications so that it reaches all sections of Naga people. Zehol said that the State Government, as policymakers, would try to integrate the interest of the coffee farmers and growers while formulating policies.

Coffee grower from Wokha, Yanthungo sharing his experience, said that earlier there was no market, but by 2008, the Land Resources Department started promoting coffee plantation. He said the farmers started growing coffee with the encouragement from the department and with doorstep delivery of coffee seed free of cost to the framers. He also appealed to the department to assist in

providing machinery and market linkages for the coffee growers in Nagaland.

Deputy Director (Extension), Coffee Board of India, Jorhat Jayanta Gosh, coffee producers and coffee entrepreneur also delivered short speeches. Altogether, 15 highest producers and largest growers from 16 districts were awarded with cash and certificates.

The event was followed by manual brewing competition, showcasing of coffee products from entrepreneurs and experiential exposure on different stages of coffee.

Advisor, Geology & Mining, W. Chingang Konyak, MLA, C. Manpon Konyak and a host of officials from various departments attended the programme.

## STATE LEVEL IDCC MEETING HELD AT KOHIMA

A state-level Inter-Departmental Coordination Committee (IDCC) meeting took place at the Conference Hall of the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Kohima on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2024. The meeting addressed several key issues related to the registration of births and deaths in Nagaland, as well as efforts to improve the Civil Registration System (CRS) across the State.

As of 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023, Nagaland operates 1,471 registration centers, with 1,439 located in rural areas and 32 in urban areas. In rural areas, each recognized village has a registration unit managed by the Head Teacher of the Government Primary School, who serves as the Registrar for births and deaths. In addition, registration units are present at Primary Health Centers (PHCs) and Community Health Centers (CHCs).

Urban areas, particularly district headquarters, have registration units located in the District Registrar's offices, typically headed by the District Economics and

Statistics Officer. Units are also available in government district hospitals, municipal offices, and town councils. To facilitate operations, Statistical staff such as Inspectors of Statistics and Field Investigators assist in managing these urban registration units.

Key agenda points discussed in the 12<sup>th</sup> IDCC meeting were:

1. **Delayed registration of births and deaths:** The State's high share of delayed birth registrations beyond 21 days was a focal point of discussion. A government notification dated 20th September 2024 mandates that indigenous inhabitants register births within six months as part of the process for applying for an Indigenous Inhabitant Certificate (IIC). The meeting addressed the need to streamline delayed registrations and the necessary documentary proof.
2. **Sensitization on birth and death registration:** Despite an increase in the number of registered births and deaths, there remains room for

improvement. Stakeholders from educational institutions, medical centers, village development boards (VDBs), and Anganwadi centers were urged to raise awareness on the importance of timely registration.

3. **Training programmes at block level:** The meeting emphasized the need for seminar-cum-training sessions for CRS functionaries including Registrars, Notifiers, and Informants to ensure they understand their roles and responsibilities. Inter-departmental coordination is seen as crucial to the success of this initiative.
4. **Online registration of births and deaths:** With the introduction of an online registration portal under the Office of the Registrar General of India (ORGI), the IDCC stressed the need for CRS functionaries to have access to smartphones, computers, and the internet for effective implementation.
5. **System of reporting:** The meeting

called attention to delays in the submission of reports to the ORGI due to anomalies in the current reporting system. Registrars are required to submit their reports to the District Economics & Statistics Office, but improvements in this process were discussed.

6. **Honorarium and incentives:** The Committee discussed the importance of providing honorarium and incentives to Registrars of Births and Deaths to ensure better coordination and motivation.
7. **Inclusion of Government Middle and High School teachers:** A proposal to include Government Middle School and High School teachers as Registrars was also considered to enhance the efficiency of the registration process.

The meeting concluded with calls for continued efforts to improve the overall civil registration process in Nagaland, particularly through greater coordination between departments and the adoption of new technologies.

## SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING FOR WOMEN FARMERS HELD

---

The state-level skill development training for women farmers under the FOCUS-Nagaland project was officially inaugurated by State Project Director, FOCUS Nagaland, Shanavas C, IAS at the Local Harvest Community Kitchen in Kohima on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2024.

In his opening remarks, Shanavas encouraged the participants to take full advantage of the opportunity and apply the knowledge gained during the training sessions to enhance their livelihood.

The FOCUS project embraces a gender-sensitive approach, recognizing women as key stakeholders in achieving its development

objectives, particularly in improving livelihoods. This training is designed to build the entrepreneurial skills of progressive women farmers by strengthening their capacities and equip them with basic skills on food processing-juice & marmalade making, baking and desserts which will enable the participants to apply the knowledge with local resources/materials available.

The panel of experts for the Skill Development training include Titoni Assumi (Proprietor of Sweet Treats, Kohima), Seno Whiso (Proprietor of Hobbylane, Kohima) and Angunuo and Neivituonuo of Self-Employed Women's Association (SEWA)

Nagaland.

The training, held from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> October 2024, was conducted in four batches and benefitted 199 women farmers from the nine FOCUS project districts, namely Longleng, Zunheboto, Kohima, Tseminyu, Phek, Wokha, Kiphire, Mon and Mokochung.

The Local Harvest-A Community Kitchen, the venue for the training, is one of the 20 Innovation Fund start-up supported by the FOCUS project. This community kitchen is an endeavour to act as a platform for dialogue and exchange learning amongst farming communities and innovations to promote local food.

A panel discussion followed, featuring CCF & Member Secretary, NSBB, Supongnukshi, IFS, Deputy Conservator of Forests (DCF), Kohima Division, Dr. Sevono Seletsu, and Luiluile Lungalang, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, Kohima Science College. Chaired by Dr. Sevono Seletsu, the panel addressed various topics raised by the participants. Queries included the Forest Department's ban on air-guns, restoring traditional wildlife corridors, and initiating research in wildlife and forestry. The experts emphasized the importance of community awareness, education, and collaboration in conservation efforts. The session also highlighted crucial step for rescuing distressed wildlife, urging immediate reporting to local forest offices rather than taking independent action.

The event marked a significant step toward raising awareness and fostering collective efforts for wildlife protection and conservation in Nagaland.

get operationalized and so in the near future, once the facilities are operationalized, the State can target for NQAS.

The participants were provided an in-depth training on the two components of revised Kayakalp Guidelines and NQAS IPHL by trainers from Regional Resource Center-NE, Guwahati comprising of Dr. Ravikar Singh, Consultant QPS RRC NE and S.L. Chochoi, Fellow QPS RRC-NE. The participants of this ToT will further train the personnel at the district level health facilities.

Kayakalp is a national initiative launched by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to promote cleanliness and enhance the quality of healthcare facilities in India. It aims to promote cleanliness, hygiene, infection control, and environment-friendly practices in public health facilities, and to inculcate a culture of ongoing assessment and peer review of performance related to hygiene, cleanliness, and sanitation.

## UNION MINISTER JUAL ORAM VISITS NAGALAND

The Union Minister also introduced the recently launched Dharti Abba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan, which was initiated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2024. The scheme is expected to benefit over five crore tribal people across India, focusing on addressing critical gaps in social infrastructure, healthcare, education, and livelihood. In Nagaland, the scheme will cover all 16 districts, 74 blocks, and 608 villages, ensuring comprehensive development support for tribal communities.

Oram explained that his visit is in line with Prime Minister, Narendra Modi's directive for Ministers to personally visit different regions of the country, particularly the Northeast, to engage with the people and address their concerns directly. He urged local officials to ensure that all government schemes are effectively implemented and reach the intended beneficiaries.

Advisor Moatoshi Longkumer raised concerns about the State's road infrastructure, requesting Oram's assistance in addressing the issue. H. Tovihoto Ayemi echoed the same sentiments, thanking Jual Oram for his presence and support for the tribal communities.

During the meeting, Oram also virtually

inaugurated the new Council Hall at Lake View Colony, Dimapur.

The meeting saw the participation of various department heads and officials. The event concluded with a press conference, where the Union Minister along with officials from Tribal Affairs, Nagaland led by Director, Sino Phom and Joint Secretary, Hito Sema and district heads interacted with the media.

While speaking at the honorary programme held at Multipurpose Hall, Zunheboto, Oram stated that the main objective of his visit is to take stock of the various government aided schemes and benefits provided to the people and survey its proper implementations. ## WORKSHOP ON AIF HELD AT CHUMOUKEDIMA

A workshop on the Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF) was held at Angh House, Agri Expo in Chumoukedima, Nagaland on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

Joint Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Samuel Praveen Kumar, delivering the keynote address, highlighted the importance of the AIF. Speaking on the transformative potential of the scheme,

Kumar emphasized its role in modernizing India's agricultural infrastructure, boosting production, and securing better returns for farmers. He underscored the scheme's benefits, including the 3% interest subvention on loans up to ₹2 crore and flexible repayment terms, as well as the broad range of eligible projects such as post-harvest management, poly houses, and logistics facilities. He

reaffirmed the government's commitment to supporting farmers, cooperatives, and agricultural organizations in leveraging the AIF to drive long-term growth in the sector.

Acknowledging the region's unique challenges, such as hilly terrain and remote villages, Kumar emphasized the government's dedication to providing financial and technical support to help farmers thrive. He also assured citizens that rural development, healthcare, and education would be prioritized to enhance the quality of life in the State. He stated that the government's initiatives include improving irrigation systems, introducing modern farming techniques, and forming cooperatives to empower small-scale farmers. He added that special attention will be given to Nagaland's unique crops and resources, with efforts to integrate them into national and global markets.

The event featured presentations on the AIF scheme, focusing on the North East Region, led by the AIF Team, focusing on

enhancing agricultural infrastructure in the North Eastern Region. The AIF aims to provide financial support for projects like cold storage, warehouses, and processing units, crucial for improving farmers' productivity and market access. During the session, the AFI highlighted the fund's attractive financing options and tailored strategies to address the unique challenges faced by farmers in the North East. Local stakeholders, including farmers and government officials, expressed optimism about the fund's potential to transform agriculture in the region.

Deputy General Manager of NABARD, O. P. Mounklang addressed the opportunities and challenges within the scheme. The AIF scheme in India is designed to boost the agricultural sector by financing infrastructure development. While the scheme holds immense potential, several challenges and opportunities accompany its implementation.

## 83<sup>rd</sup> MEETING OF BRAHMAPUTRA BOARD HELD AT CHUMOUKEDIMA

The 83<sup>rd</sup> meeting of Brahmaputra Board was held at Niathu Resort, Chumoukedima on 14<sup>th</sup> October 2024 hosted by the Department of Water Resources, Nagaland, and chaired by the Chairman of Brahmaputra Board, Dr. Ranbir Singh, IAS(R).

Brahmaputra Board under the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Department of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, is a body established by the Government of India to plan and implement erosion control works and flood control measures in the North East Region (NER). The event saw participation from Central Government bodies like Brahmaputra Board, NERIWALM, NEHARI, Survey of India etc. and State Government departments of Water Resources represented by Chief Engineers from all NE states except Sikkim.

While welcoming the members, the Chairman, Dr. Ranbir Singh reiterated on the need of mutual collaboration among like-minded and allied departments and agencies to frame sustainable projects in the NER pertaining to water resources management and conservation, adding that North Eastern States are very important because NE has the mightiest river Brahmaputra and NE accounts for 30% of almost one-third of local body water resource management. He said that NE has to play a big role not as agencies

but as an organisation to address the issues of strengthening the Brahmaputra board, to be in a position to provide the technical support and guidance and resources through the states.

Dr. Ranbir Singh pointed out that one important contribution in the context of the Brahmaputra Board is to provide manpower as there is a severe shortage of Deputy Engineers, Superintending Engineers, Executive Engineers etc. He appealed all the states to sponsor a candidate for the project to develop Brahmaputra Board and if such officers are deputed, then in the next five years we can transform the board in a different way. India is committed to it, hence he urged all the State stakeholders to work towards the progress of Brahmaputra Board.

The event also showcased innovative designs from Water Resources Department, Nagaland that incorporates power generation component in the irrigation works and the concept of Trench Weir which is specifically designed for irrigation in hilly regions and a Web-GIS technology developed inhouse by WRD, Meghalaya for mapping of springs in the State. The State of Mizoram also presented an ongoing study of spring restoration-cum-recharge project under National Hydrology Project, a positive trend being observed in the discharge of the springs.

## CHIEF SECRETARY CHAIRS AHOds/HODs MEETING

Chief Secretary, Dr. J. Alam IAS convened a meeting of all the Administrative Heads of Departments and Heads of Departments (AHOds/HODs) at Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

departmental projects being delayed, Alam urged all the concerned departments to take up every departmental project seriously and complete each project at the stipulated time.

Emphasizing on the importance of capacity building and training for the senior level officers, Alam said that there is no age limit for learning and hence encouraged all officers to enroll in upcoming training programmes and also to keep themselves updated with the rules of executive business.

The members also shared their suggestions and feedbacks during the meeting.

### DEPUTY CM, Y. PATTON INSPECTS BORDER DISPUTE AREAS IN MOKOKCHUNG

Nagaland Deputy Chief Minister, Y. Patton along with senior officials, visited two villages under Tuli area of Mokokchung district on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2024, to address the ongoing border disputes with neighboring Assam. Patton, who also holds the portfolio for Home and Border Affairs, was accompanied by Advisor for Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, A. Pangjung Jamir, Home Secretary, DGP Rupin Sharma and his subordinates, and the district administration.

The team inspected key areas of concern, including the Assam Police Commando Battalion camp at Septsuyong Lu in Kangtsung village and Wameken Yimsen village. The visit aimed to assess the situation on the ground and engage with

local stakeholders amid growing tensions in the border area.

In discussions with the villagers and representatives of Ao Senden, Patton highlighted that the Nagaland Cabinet had held a meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2024 to deliberate on the matter, emphasizing the government's serious approach to resolving the dispute. He informed the villagers that letters had been sent to the Prime Minister, Home Minister, and the Chief Minister of Assam to address the issue and that the state cabinet would be meeting with them soon. Patton also urged the villagers not to sell their land to non-indigenous people, stressing the importance of preserving local land ownership in the region.

During the India Mobile Congress (IMC) 2024 held at Pragati Maidan, New

Delhi on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2024, a delegation from Nagaland, led by H. Sethrongkyu

During the event, Union Minister, Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Minister of State, Dr. Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani, Ministry of Communications, Government of India along with Chief Ministers, IT Ministers, and officials from various states across India also attended the event, further enriching the discussions on the future of India's telecom sector.

Director, Industries & Commerce, Tokugha Achumi presented the keynote address, while Vithule Krichena, Consultant, PM Vishwakarma delivered a presentation on the PMV scheme.

Zeliang stressed on the significance of having a free and smooth traffic during the peak season of festival, especially on NH-29, where most of the tourists and dignitaries from abroad would be travelling. On certain stretches of the highway, NHIDCL and NH (NPWD) had raised reservation to complete the road within the time frame as committed in the 11th September 2024 meeting. They cited incessant rain which has marred the progress of the work. However, Deputy Chief Minister and Commissioner & Secretary Works & Housing categorically stated that

extension of deadline is beyond question and unacceptable as inflow of tourists and dignitaries are anticipated by mid-November.

Commissioner & Secretary, Land Revenue has been directed to put up the land rates for the districts through which NH-202 passes. Once approved by the State Government, the land rates would be incorporated in the DPR and sent to the Ministry for early sanction of the project.

In his speech, Sharma highlighted the historical significance of Police Commemoration Day, which dates back

to 21<sup>st</sup> October 1959. On this day, a CRPF mobile patrol party led by Deputy Central Intelligence Officer, Singh was ambushed by Chinese troops at Hot Springs in Ladakh, resulting in the deaths of 10 men. The remaining personnel were taken as prisoners, and the Chinese forces later returned the bodies of the fallen soldiers on 13<sup>th</sup> November 1959. The cremation of the martyrs took place the following day at Hot



Springs, located at an altitude of 16,000 feet. To honor the sacrifices of these brave men, the heads of police from all the Indian states decided in 1960 to observe 21<sup>st</sup> October as Police Commemoration Day every year. The day serves as a reminder of the selfless service and ultimate sacrifice made by police personnel in the line of duty across India.

Sharma solemnly noted that, over the past year, 214 policemen, throughout the country, laid down their lives while protecting the nation's integrity and ensuring the safety and security of its citizens. Their dedication contributes to creating a peaceful environment for economic development and the progress of individuals across the country, he said.

The DGP particularly honored the memory of four brave martyrs from the Nagaland Police who sacrificed their lives under challenging circumstances while performing their duties. He also acknowledged the relentless efforts of all Nagaland Police personnel over the past year. Despite missing out on celebrations with their families, the officers worked with

unwavering dedication to maintain law and order, and contributed to the peaceful conduct of two state elections in 2024.

Sharma emphasized that Police Commemoration Day is not only a day of mourning but also a celebration of the spirit of selfless sacrifice demonstrated by police officers who have become immortal through their deeds. 'Today, let us renew our pledge to serve our people, secure our nation, and make the supreme sacrifice when needed,' he concluded.

The ceremony concluded with Assistant Inspector General of Police (Coordination) Tokavi Achumi reading the roll of honor, followed by the traditional wreath-laying ceremony by various units and senior officers.

The 7<sup>th</sup> NAP Battalion, Bhandari along with the rest of the police fraternity of the nation, also observed the Police Commemoration Day at the Unit Police Memorial Complex, 7<sup>th</sup> NAP Battalion, Bhandari, Wokha on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2024. Commandant, 7<sup>th</sup> NAP Bhandari, Menangmeren reviewed the parade and highlighted the significance of the day.

## EARTHQUAKE DISASTER MOCK DRILL CONDUCTED ACROSS THE STATE

On 24<sup>th</sup> October 2024, the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) conducted its annual Nagaland Emergency Preparedness Exercise (NEPEX) 2024 across Kohima, simulating a large-scale earthquake scenario with a magnitude of 6.9.

The mock drill, aimed at assessing the preparedness and coordination of emergency teams, was carried out at five key locations including Government Middle School (Bayavü), Directorate of Industries & Commerce Office, Naga Hospital Authority Kohima (NHAK), Miachieo Lhithochü, and Sanuorü Bridge. A central control room was set up at the Deputy Commissioner's Office, with the High School Ground designated as the staging area for emergency responders. Additionally, a relief camp was established at Indira Gandhi Stadium to provide shelter and aid to simulated victims.

The drill involved critical teams from various departments, including

As part of the celebration of Right to Information (RTI) Week from 5<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2024 Peren district celebrated the Right to Information Week 2024 at St. Xavier College, Jalukie on 8<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

Chief Information Commissioner, Nagaland, I. Meyionen Jamir speaking at the event, said the Right to Information Act was passed in 2005 with an aim to promote transparency and accountability in the functioning of the government and to contain corruption, which are essential for the functioning of a healthy democracy. He disclosed that total number of 2472 RTI applications were recorded in the State during the period of 2023-24 with an increase of 368 as compared to the previous year's record of 2104. The overall percentage of information furnished by the PIOs of various Public Authorities during 2023-24 was 2173 which comes to 87.90%. Further, he disclosed that the Directorates received the highest number of RTI applications, followed by the Districts and Secretariat.

Mentioning that Peren district (106) is the third district next to Kohima (239) & Dimapur (134) in receiving the highest number of RTI applicants during 2023-24, he said Peren district was chosen for this programme, adding that the district has many other tribes apart from Zeliang tribe and there is a need to educate and create awareness among the people to know their rights and entitlement in regard to various welfare schemes being implemented especially by the development departments.

A PowerPoint presentation was presented by State Information Commissioner, Nosazol Charles, wherein he explained the working of the RTI Act in detail. This was followed by an interactive session with the participants. The event also saw the participation of 511 attendees from various Heads of Departments, Administrative Officers, Town Councillors, CSOs, GBs, Village Councils, VDBs, church leaders and college students.

Municipal Act 2023 to discharge their duties and responsibilities smoothly. He also mentioned that the department will give technical support if needed but execution of plans at ground level should be judiciously implemented by the ULB representatives within their respective jurisdictions.

IPOS Commissioner & Secretary, Municipal Affairs Department & UDD, Kekhrievor Kevichusa in his keynote address, stated that as per the regulations of power in Municipal Act, sanitation is one of the primary responsibilities of the ULB and this is a small step towards the department helping to achieve the work of keeping their urban local bodies clean and hygiene. Commission assistance.

### **KOHIMA REGIONAL TRANSPORT AUTHORITY MEETING HELD**

The Regional Transport Authority (RTA) of Kohima convened a meeting at the Deputy Commissioner's Office Conference Hall, Kohima on 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2024. The meeting was presided over by DC, Kumar Ramnikant, IAS, and addressed a wide range of transport and traffic-related issues impacting the district.

MLA & Chairman of the District Planning & Development Board Kohima, Dr. Tseilhoutuo Rhutso expressed concern over the growing traffic congestion in Kohima, which has significantly hindered daily activities and caused stagnation in movement. He emphasized the need for a comprehensive study to explore alternative routes and traffic management solutions, particularly in light of the increased traffic expected during the Hornbill Festival. He stressed that collective effort and cooperation would be essential in finding a lasting solution.

The meeting included discussions on several key issues, including the presence of off-road vehicles, which contribute to parking challenges in the city. The possibility of removing such vehicles and identifying a designated junkyard for them was considered as a step toward alleviating parking problems. Additionally, discussions were held regarding the opening and closing of specific routes, as well as the timing of truck movements and their entry into the city, especially during the festival period.

In terms of school transportation, the meeting resolved that all school buses in Kohima must be painted yellow, equipped with emergency doors, and display both vehicle numbers and driver contact information to enhance safety standards.

The need to study and identify new traffic routes to ease congestion was also highlighted, with a recommendation to

submit a feasibility report on the proposed routes.

The meeting was attended by key officials including the Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC), Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) Sardar, Additional Superintendent

of Police (Traffic & Protocol), Deputy Superintendent of Police (Traffic), Regional Transport Officer of Kohima, Kohima Municipal Council (KMC) and representatives from various transport sectors.

The board directed the Tennis Ball Cricket Association of Nagaland, Dimapur to obtain an NOC from its parent association for recommendation and approval for registration from the state government.

The board also discussed on the Nagaland Special Development Zone (NSDZ) for Dimapur district and forwarded it to the State Government for necessary action.

The Department of Public Health Engineering (PHE) and Food & Civil Supplies presented PowerPoint updates on their recent activities, progress, and departmental achievements in the district.

Advisor Jakhalu introduced new schemes under Industries & Commerce, including RAMP, UNNATI, and MSME schemes. ## ENSURING SAFE WORKPLACES: UNDERSTANDING WOMEN'S RIGHTS AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT

In an effort to ensure safe working environments for women, the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013, also known as the POSH Act, was established. This legislation aims to create workplaces that respect women's right to equality of status and opportunity, protecting them from harassment.

### Understanding sexual harassment at the workplace:

The Supreme Court defines sexual harassment as any unwelcome, sexually determined physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct. The following acts are considered forms of sexual harassment:

1. Physical contact or advances.
2. Requests or demands for sexual favors.
3. Making sexually colored remarks.
4. Showing pornography.
5. Any other unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature.

Recognizing such behaviour is the first step towards prevention. It is defined by being unwelcome and sexual in nature, often occurring within a power imbalance. The focus is on the impact rather than the intent of the behaviour.

### Key features of the Act:

#### 1. ***Applies to all workplaces:***

This law covers both organized and unorganized sectors, protecting women of all ages and employment statuses.

#### 2. ***Internal Complaints Committee (ICC):***

Employers must establish an ICC,

comprising internal and external members to handle complaints impartially.

#### 3. ***Duties of ICC:***

The ICC is responsible for conducting confidential inquiries, ensuring fair hearings, and recommending appropriate actions.

#### 4. ***Penalties for non-compliance:***

Employers failing to comply with the Act may face severe fines, potential license cancellation, and other penalties.

#### 5. ***Safe redressal mechanism:***

The law emphasizes creating a supportive environment for reporting incidents, with strict measures for maintaining confidentiality.

### Women's Rights under the Act:

Every woman has the legal right to a safe workplace. Sexual harassment is a gross violation of a woman's right to equality and dignity. All workplaces are legally required to maintain a safe and secure environment free from harassment. According to the POSH Act, an 'aggrieved woman' is a woman, who in relation to a workplace, alleges to have been sexually harassed. This Act recognizes the rights of every woman and aims to create a safe and secure workplace environment for all of them. This definition covers every woman, employed or not, irrespective of their age, work, status, etc.

### Speaking up against harassmen:

Sexual harassment should not be tolerated under any circumstances. Women who experience unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature that creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment are

encouraged to file a complaint without fear of retaliation. Complaints can be made to the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) or to the Local Complaints Committee (LCC) if an ICC is not available.

By understanding their rights and knowing the resources available, women can take action against harassment and contribute to creating safer workplaces for everyone.
